Simple Plan For Dressing Table

If your growing daughter is fascinated by the idea of her own dressing table, here's a simple way to give her, and her room, a treat. Transform a square window in the room into a dressing table setting. First build a valance on top of the window and extend it well beyond the window at both sides. Then build a shelf over the window sill and extend it the width of the valance above. Construct small narrow shelves on each side of the window. Decorate the side shelves with a bright and gay shelving paper pattern. Use the same border to trim the valance and the edge of the sill-shelf. Use the sill shelf for comb and brush, small mirror and other regular dressing table items. Devote the small side shelves to miniature dolls, favorite pictures, vases of flowers and other little-girl "show-off" items.

WORK OF WORLD-WIDE Y PROVIDES NEW LIFE FOR BOY TURNED BEAST

Did you ever hear the story of Franz Schneider?

He lived in Warsaw during the second World War. He was a boy of nine when he had to dig himself out of the rubble caused by the bombing of his house in the ghetto. Looking around him he found the head and the legs of his mother, separated from her beloved body. He found his father with his breast pressed between two beams like a walnut in a nutcracker.

He heard the terrible stillness in the air after the explosion and the trickling of drops of blood on the ground. He pulled and pulled to get the beams away from the body but he was too weak. After an hour it was not necessary anymore for then he knew that his father was dead.

And this was just the beginning of the life of little Franz Schneider from Warsaw. He roamed around, living like a beast, hunted like a rat, sent around camps like a post parcel and beaten and tortured by the Germans.

In the end he WAS a beast; a little dangerous animal—of a little, with rags instead of clothes, with instinct instead of human thought and with hate in his heart for everything that was called human.

After the day he escaped from the camp, he walked in the arms of the YMCA in Western Germany and a new world was opened for him. He saw the DP camps with the program of sports, schools, hikes and everything he ever dreamt of.

I met Franz Schneider in 1950 in a training camp for YMCA secretaries in Mainau, near Switzerland. He had just received his visa to go to the United States. Now he is secretary in one of the YMCA branches over there.

Just a story? Yes, but the plain truth. Travelling around western Europe, Egypt and the United States as YMCA secretary, I saw many of those people who were helped by the YMCA in the most miserable time of their life. Working among homeless people; serving groups without any possibilities in life left; giving them what they need; this is the work of the YMCA.
