Bradford Takes 2 Goal Lead Into Final Game

The Ontario Lacrosse Association Intermediate C championship will be decided on Saturday night in Bradford with the home team holding a two goal edge over the heads of the Acton Rams.

In a contest that was typical of the six previous games between the two clubs, they went at it hammer and tongs with only one or two goals between them most of the way.

The large contingent of Bradford fans nearly blew the roof off the old ice palace when Rowntree broke through for the insurance goal, especially when they were short-handed. But they shouldn't have been surprised. Acton blew a two goal lead in the third quarter while the same Bradford player, Bray, sat out a sentence for slashing. The Acton defense seemed to wilt when they had a one man advantage.

Bradford Takes Early Lead

The visiting team chalked up three goals before Acton got a reply in the first quarter on Saturday.

It took only two minutes of the second quarter for Acton to tie the score with Lloyd Smith scoring two assists going to Watkins and Gerrie respectively.

Both netminders were tested in the early minutes of the fourth and final quarter, but it was Bullfit, the visiting netminder who pulled the slack up for Bradford.

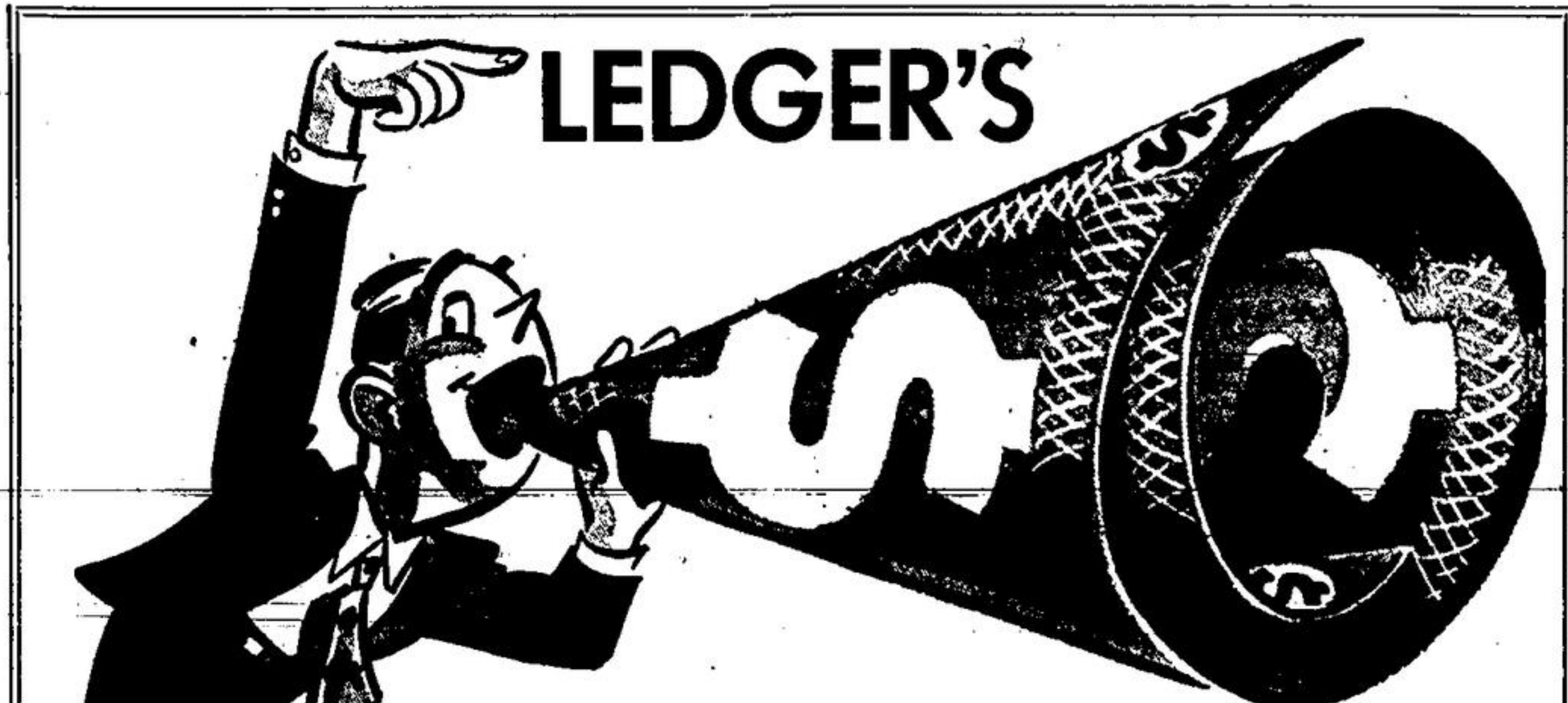
