

Plan Elimination Of Level Crossings

Hon. George H. Doucet, Ontario Minister of Highways, announces that the Department is now building or has proposals for building grade separations at 25 existing level crossings in many parts of the province. Some of these crossings, now being eliminated, or that will be eliminated when orders are issued by the Board of Transport Commissioners for Canada have been scenes of distressing tragedies.

Lower Middle Road, Trafalgar township, will be rebuilt as a four lane undivided auxiliary highway to relieve industrial area congestion on Queen Elizabeth Way, back of the new Ford Motor Co. plant. There will be a grade separation with Canadian National Railway. Detailed plans are not yet completed. Application for authorizing the order was made to the Board of Transport Commissioners for Canada.

"This serious problem is one that greatly concerns the Provincial Government of Ontario," Mr. Doucet said. "Our part in solving it is being carried out in a two-way drive. First, knowing that all level crossings can't be eliminated immediately, or even soon due to the cost of such a wholesale project, the Department's traffic engineering branch is making a constant study of level crossings in relation to ordinary and special dangers and both in relation to their use by automotive and other traffic. Second, actual construction is under the direct supervision of some of the Department's most experienced engineers."

Total cost of grade separation now underway or likely to be authorized soon may total, on an unofficial estimate, something like \$4,700,000.

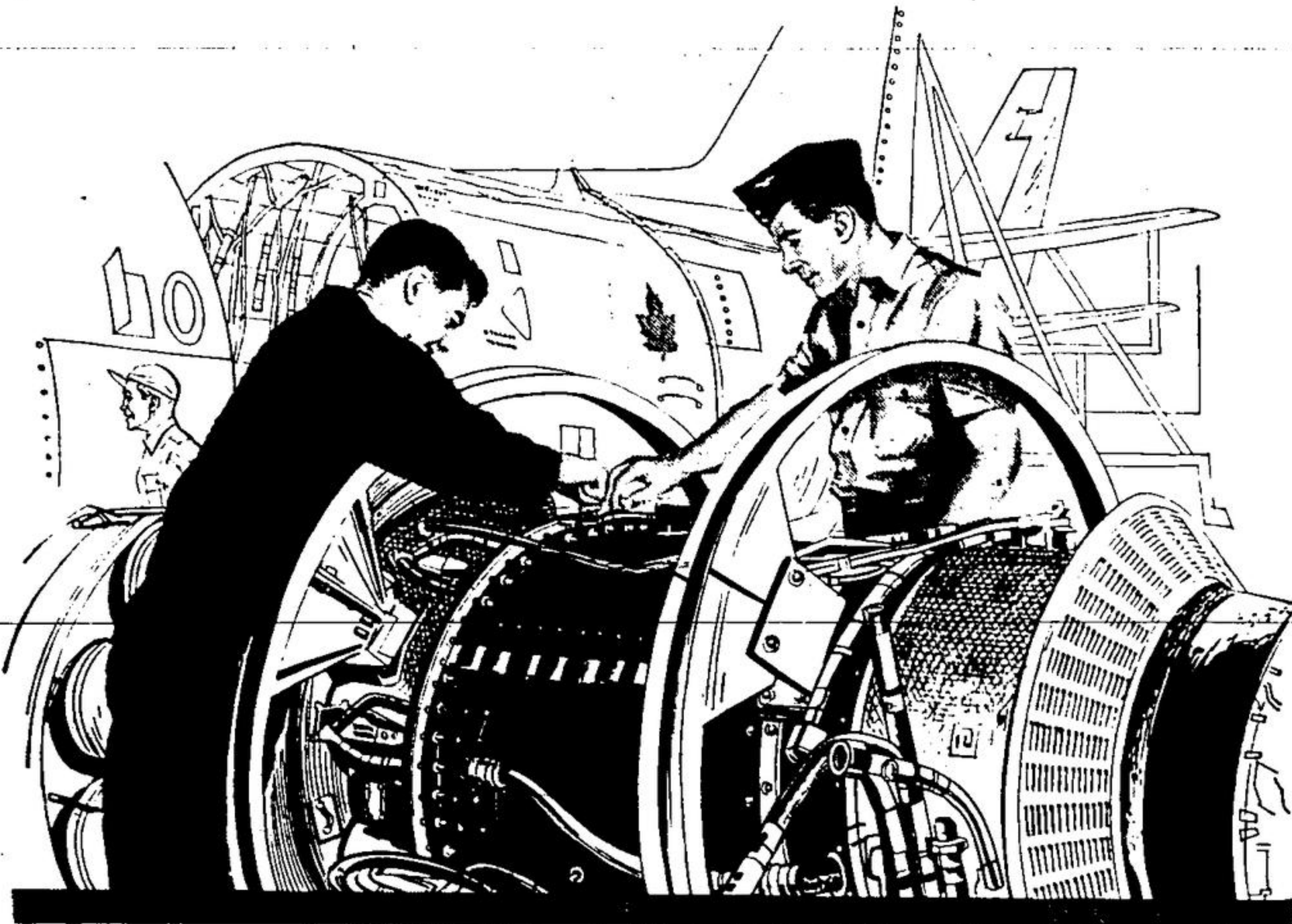
