Actually, tuning a TV set is a pretty simple operation. The chief reason so many people don't do as fine a tuning job as they might in that they neglect to read the instruction pamphlets.

The basic rules of good television luning are simple enough to be followed by children and frequent-

A TV set is tuned by eye, so to speak. Turn the volume knob H: was ordanged at a charge in half way and then adjust the tuning knob for the clearest picture. This will also be the position for sound volume to the desired level bring brightness up to point where the picture is fairly visible and adjust contrast to bring out picture details for the most pleasing pict-

> Spend a few seconds with the brightness and bontrast knobs to make the picture exactly suit your individual taste and that's it. On a properly engineered receiver, it should not be necessary to touch different station, the set may be with only minor adjustment of the volume, brightness and contrast knobs to suit your own taste.

The most common tuning mistake is overloading the picture tube with too much brightness and contrast. This won't hurt the tube but it will certainly spoil your enjoyment of the reception.

A lot of TV fans douse all lights when the set is in use. However, a home televison screen is four or five times brighter than a movie screen and can be viewed with perfect comfort in a room with normal lighting.


