MORE THAN 200 HONOR GEO. LESLIE AT WARDEN'S DINNER LAST WEEK

Over 200 past and present officials of Halton county and men and women prominent in the municipal life of the county, attended the annual warden's dinner last Thursday night and joined in honoring George L. Leslie, reeve of Georgetown township, and 1953 Warden of the county. The event was held in the Legion Hall, Georgetown, and a delicious and bountiful turkey dinner was served by the Ladies Auxiliary of the Georgetown Legion.

The Warden's Dinner in Halton is the one place where all those who are living and have taken a prominent part in municipal affairs are most likely to meet. Like the county, it is getting bigger each year. One hundred used to be the limit and this year that figure was doubled.

Chairman for the program was Le Roy Dale, Q.C. and Rev Alex J. Calder said grace. On behalf of the town of Georgetown Mayor Jack Armstrong extended a welcome. Guest speaker was Rev. R. K.
