Our worries were purely local — the weather, the price of wheat and oats, harvesting our crops and the health of our families. To-day we have the same worries, plus the pressure of modern living. News comes to us hot off the wires. To keep pace with it we need a brain as agile as a cricket. Whether we live in the city or country makes little difference.

For this reason don't you think we should make an effort to get a little more quietness into our lives? Don't let your mind be cluttered after hours of day after day.
