Of Pioneer Family, Geo. Graham Dies

Crewson's Corners and the Rockwood and Acton district lost another well-known resident in the death of George Graham on February 18, in his 78th year.

Mr. Graham was a son of George L. Graham and Violet Murdoch, who were born on opposite sides of the Scottish and English border. He was a grandson of James Graham, who came from the north of England in 1842 and landed in Guelph with 25c in his pocket. In 1873 the Grahams came to Framosa, where four generations have set a pattern and wielded an influence that earned universal respect and esteem.

Until his retirement a few years ago through failing health, George Graham was a welcome visitor and a sincere friend in any home in the vicinity of the old homestead on lot 2, concession 7 of Framosa. He was an able houseman and usually drove a spanking team, to be admired by old and young alike, as they appeared on the road to Acton or Rockwood. He will be missed by a host of friends in a wide area.

Surviving are his widow, Mary McCaw; his brother, Rev. William Graham of Powell River, B.C.; his sister, Agnes (Mrs. Charles Taylor) of Nanton, Alberta and a large number of nephews and nieces.

Funeral services were conducted by his pastor, Rev. R. H. Armstrong at the Victor Rumley and Son funeral home in Acton on February 20. Interment was in Fairview cemetery, Acton.

Pallbearers were Orrie Lamb, William McPhedran, Stan Norton, and three nephews, Lloyd Myer, Dave Atkins and John Locker. Numerous floral tributes attested to the esteem in which Mr. Graham was held.
