Green Light Can Be Greatest Traffic Hazard: Highways Department Expert

The feeling of safety which comes over a motorist when he sees a green light is the greatest of all traffic hazards, according to the Highways Department Chief Surveyor, W. H. Fulton.

In a special report to Highways Minister Doucett recently, Mr. Fulton outlined his findings on traffic lights throughout the province.

"People put too much trust in a green light," he said. "Green lights don't mean safety; they rather warn us of danger."

Critics often lose sight of the fact that the real purpose of highways is to move traffic. The installation of a traffic light does not always facilitate this movement.

To start with, a fixed time light, with equal intervals each way, puts the highway out of commission for six months of the year.

Department experience has shown that only when certain traffic conditions exist should a light be installed. There are five warrants which the department checks before installation.

"Quite often when a fatal accident happens at an intersection, the coroner's jury recommends that a light be installed, but a traffic light should not be installed because of a spectacular accident."
