#### Disease Prevention Is Cheaper Than Death

performance in a disease prevention role was drawn by Dr. Bull in his recent address to County Council. Submitting the budget proposal for 1954, which called for expenditure of an estimated \$63,110, he revealed:

"\$60,000 may seem like a large amount to spend on health, but it is an investment which pays big dividends. In 1900 the death rate from diptheria was 33.9 per 100,000. If this rate prevailed today we could expect to have 17 deaths and approximately 170 cases of diptheria during 1954.

"It is not possible to calculate the value of human life in dollars and cents, but if we allot an amount as the estimated cost of such illness and death to the community we obtain some interesting

A startling illustration of the Health Unit's figures. If for each death we allot an amount of \$500 as current expenses and \$10,000 as loss of earning power we find that each death cost the com munity \$10,500. For 17 deaths the amount is \$178,500. Each of the 170 illnesses represents a loss to the community of at least \$300 and a total

> "The grand total is \$229,500. An amount which is more than three times our annual budget. How many cases of diptheria did we have last year? Not a single one. I can assure you that we will not have an epidemic of this disease so long as we continue to immunize all of the children.
