

Palermo Statue Spid Misleading

A suggestion that the CBC and the National Film Board produce anti-Communist programs and films was made in the Commons.

Russell Reinke (L. — Hamilton South) said some public funds could be spent "to bring to the attention of the Canadian people the purpose, effects and results of Communism."

"These productions would remind Canadians to guard their freedoms. Freedom is like a bag of sand," he said. "If there is a hole anywhere in the bag, all the sand will run out."

Speaking at the resumption of the Commons speech debate, Mr. Reinke indicated alarm that a 22 foot bronze monument on a picnic ground in Palermo, Ont., was sent to the Association of United Ukrainian Canadians by the Soviet Ukraine.

The English and Ukrainian inscriptions on the monument were purposely different to mislead the public, he said.

The Ukrainian inscription, he said, was misleading and indicated that the monument was sent to the Commons of the Labor-Progressive party by a Communist government.

Mr. Reinke said later outside the Commons that the Association of United Ukrainian Canadians should not be confused with the National Federation which he described as an anti-Communist league.

The association, he said in the Commons, owned the Palermo property east of Hamilton. It also owned some 100 acres of land in Ontario, a \$1,000,000 co-operative and a \$3,000,000 insurance business.

Outside the Commons he told reporters the Palermo property is used as a summer camp for young Canadians who are taught Communist ideas.

"For a long time I dreamed of what I'd do when I got better," she said. "Then one day I faced the fact that nothing was happening, so I made plans."

Her plans in a year and a half have turned into a flourishing business. She has two married daughters and one son, an RCAF jet instructor, and thought she had enough experience with grandchildren to give the baby-sitting market a try.
