Claims Councillors Are Not Arbiters

68 Church St. E. Acton, Ont., Feb. 20, 1955. To Mr. A. Dilla, Editor, Acton Free Press. Dear Sir: I would appreciate the opportunity to express my opinion on a very contentious issue, through your letter to the editor column. The Mayor and certain members of the town council have in their official capacity taken unwarranted action in intervening in an industrial dispute. The Mayor and council were elected to represent us in conducting the business of our town, and not as arbiters between management and labor in the industries of this town. The difficulties of labor-management disputes can be complicated enough without outside interference. I hold no brief for the U.E. or any other union, but I do think the employees of the company concerned have a right to meet the representatives of the U.E. or any other union of their choice in a democratic manner. If the company concerned does not wish the U.E. to act as bargaining agent, it is their right to legally oppose it, but it is not for our town council to pull chestnuts out of the fire for them. Our Mayor did a good job for us last term, but this term he has reverted to the dictatorial methods which caused us to turn him out of office four years ago. Perhaps it is time for us to again show our disapproval in a democratic manner at the polls next December and turn him out again, if he has the intestinal fortitude to press a quote of Mr. Tyler's words, which were: "I understand more cravely to stand for re-election. May I hope that in the future the town council will mind QUIR business and not become involved in matters which are entirely industrial or political.
