William's father, George L. Graham, was an elder for many years in Rockwood Presbyterian church; his mother Violet Murdoch, was connected with the well known family of blacksmiths of that name at Marden.

John W. Graham, a former elder of the Presbyterian and United churches at Rockwood, who died in 1949, was George's brother. Joseph, who recently died at Acton, was another brother of the Powell River pastor.
