Durham were the opposition for Campbellville in the second round of the O.P. Intermediate C playdowns and the first game of the series went to the defending champions as they came out on the long end of a 9-3 score in Campbellville on Saturday, September 10.

Durham's ace right-hander, Erv Garvie, did the hurling for the gamblers and gave up eight hits, walked three and struck out nine. Jack Roberts was on the mound for Campbellville and allowed seven hits, two walks and struck out three.

Durham scored first in the first inning. Grant opened the batting with a single, was sacrificed to and second went to third when Moore threw badly to first on Weisgrunder and was squeezed in by Jackson. Campbellville came right back to tie it up in the bottom of the first. With two out Henderson walked and scored all the way from first when Early smashed a long double into left centre.

Durham took a 3-1 lead in the top of the fourth when Faulkner singled and Garvie blasted a home run over the left field fence. Again Campbellville came right back to score three runs in the bottom of the fourth to make the score 4-3. Wingrove was safe on an error by the second baseman and stole second. Earl Cairns walked and they then pulled a double steal to put men on second and third. Jack Roberts then hit a tremendous blast on Early's sacrifice fly to right. With two out in the sixth, singles by Roberts' and Moore put men on first and second. Roberts stole third and romped in as the catcher threw into left field.

The left fielder, trying to get Moore going into third, threw the third baseman's head into the crowd, letting Moore in and making the score 7-3. With two out in the bottom of the seventh a single by Elliott, a double by Bill Cairns and a single by Wingrove produced two more runs and completed the scoring.

Grant and Faulkner each hit two singles for Durham. Garvie had a home run and Lake and W. Nixon singled. Jack Roberts with a home run and a single led the Campbellville attack. Ken Moore hit two singles. Early and Bill Cairns each doubled and Bill Elliott and Allan Wingrove hit singles.

The second game of this series will be played in Durham at 5 p.m. on Friday, September 16. The third game if necessary will be in Durham on Saturday, September 17 at 3 p.m.
