The present Y secretary is Bob Brayshaw, whose most current venture is the already-crowded So-Ed club, which begins its programming shortly.

Problem of all secretaries has been to interest adults in the work of the Y. Certainly advance registration in the So-Ed club for adults from 18 to 40, evidences that Mr. Brayshaw is succeeding in drawing older people as well as the always eager youngsters into the Y.

Mr. and Mrs. Brayshaw, who come from Kingston, live in the apartment above the Y. Recent secretaries have been Dick Schull, who left to return to Holland, Bob Redfern and Cliff Sutton, who is now a recreational director in Brampton.

The Y's Men's club, one of the town's busiest organizations, meets regularly for supper in the building. It began in 1940. Jack Creighton, who was a charter member, hasn't missed a meeting in all those years.

Within a month of the opening of the Y in 1935, the membership was just over 80. Of course, full programming had not yet begun. Today there are almost 200 children members and over 100 adult members.

Just Twenty Years Ago

Acton Was World's Smallest Village to Have a Y

Exactly 20 years ago next Monday Acton's Y.M.C.A. building was officially opened at a ceremony in the brand-new building. It was a \$20,000 bequest from an Acton man, the late J. A. Murray, that made Acton the smallest village in the world to have its own Y.M.C.A.

The interest of the entire town has been sustained in the building since then, with a succession of capable Y secretaries providing leadership for dozens of clubs and activities.

The will of the late J. A. Murray was published in the Free Press in July, 1930. It said in part:

"To the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Acton, the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) subject to the conditions set out in Paragraph 3 hereof. The said mentioned sum, however, shall be held in trust by my Executors and Trustees and the income thereof, amounting to \$1,000.00 a year shall be paid to my said wife until the Council of the said village shall undertake and agree to build or provide a home for poor or sick children and aged or helpless people who are in need of charity, or a Young Men's Christian Association Building or a Building to be used jointly by the Young Men's and Young Women's Christian Associations, when my Executors shall pay over the said sum to the Council of the said village on its undertaking to pay the said yearly income to my wife."

The will went on at some length with details. It was after the death of Mrs. Murray in 1933 that plans began, and the committee decided the form the building should take.

An auspicious opening of the Free Press of exactly 20 years ago stated: "The community interest in Acton's new Murray Memorial Y.M.C.A. was evident by the gathering at the official opening last night, when the building was filled to capacity with a crowd of 400 or more, and numbers were unable to gain admission. It was surely an auspicious opening of the latest community asset. The scene would have gladdened the heart of the late J. A. Murray had he been able to witness it. It certainly showed an appreciation of the building and work that his beneficence has made possible."

On this occasion his only brother Mr. W. A. Murray, was able to be present and occupy a seat on the platform and he and Mrs. Murray, along with Mr. and Mrs. G. Murray, attended this opening.

"The platform with local presidents were associated representatives from visiting Y.M.C.A. organizations, representatives of the National Council and the local clergy. An orchestra, under the direction of Mr. Chas. Mason, provided a splendid musical program."

"Mr. G. W. Murray, chairman of the Murray Memorial Committee, and nephew of the late J. A. Murray, spoke. He was honored at being at the gathering and taking part."



FOLLOWING A BEQUEST of \$20,000 from the late J. A. Murray, Acton's attractive Y.M.C.A. building was officially opened 20 years ago. About 400 attended the ceremonies in the new building and activities began at once. The building houses the Public Utilities office, the library, Masonic Hall and an apartment upstairs as well as the Y.M.C.A. rooms and gymnasium.

Board of Directors Supervises Work

The Y.M.C.A. now operates under a 12-man board of directors, under the president, Ken Knox. G. W. McKenzie is vice-president; Mrs. J. Hurst, secretary, and Mike Cox, treasurer. Chairman are: publicity, Phil Caddick; religious emphasis and world service, Rev. Evan Jones; adult, Bruce Shoemaker; boys and girls work, Clinton Taylor; finance, Bill Wilson; building, Jack Ridley; the Y's Men's representative is Elmer Smith and the ladies' representative Mrs. Doug Rogers.

Changes Made In 20 Years

The Y.M.C.A. building, 58 feet by 84 feet, is just as attractive now as it was 20 years ago when hundreds strolled through the various rooms to inspect the town's newest building.

As now, the library, Masonic Lodge rooms, and Public Utilities office were in the building with an apartment upstairs.

A considerable number of changes have been made in the Y since then. Among the most recent are the relocation of shower rooms and locker rooms, and the addition of a door from the downstairs meeting room.

Acton Y Delegate At Week-End Meet

Last week-end Mrs. Molly Riddale was Acton Y's delegate at the National Young Adult Council Meeting at Camp Edgewood near Guelph. On the agenda at the two day meet were plans for future Y work in Canada.

The adaptation of some of the suggestions made at the recent world conference in Paris for Canada was considered. Extension of Y programming was another topic. A luncheon conference to be held at Geneva Park, Lake Couchiching, in 1936 was planned.
