

### Lacrosse Team In All-Ontario Pee-Wee Meet

A team from Acton took part in the All-Ontario Pee-Wee Lacrosse tournament in Fergus and Elora on Saturday, September 24, as part of increasing Minor Lacrosse activities in the province. The Acton boys lost 8-4 to the Toronto Roden Athletic Club.

Mark Lefriere has been instructing the local boys.

At the annual convention of the Ontario Lacrosse Association (O.L.A.) for 1955, it was decided to form a Minor Lacrosse Committee, which would be held responsible for the workings of all Minor Lacrosse teams from Novice to Juvenile inclusive and would go into full operation in 1956. This committee was to be formed in 1955 and go over the province during the year and make a full report of all players by organizing all towns and villages possible and appointing someone as Organization to look after the players in their respective community.

At the end of 1955 they are to come back to the Annual Convention of the O.L.A. with a report of their work and if necessary a separate Constitution, if it is felt that the present Parent Bodies' Rules and Regulations were inadequate for Minors.

It was felt that a group spending all their time on the minors could help bring the game back. A six man committee with Walter Murphy, Windsor and recently of Peterborough as chairman was formed. The committee meets approximately every two weeks and they in turn have appointed district conveners throughout the province who report to committee members.

Each district convener forwards the needs for requirements such as lacrosse sticks, balls, nets, etc. and one of the main body look into the requirements and recommend whether any help should be given to the clubs and gives his report to the governing Minor Committee, who set or refuse on his recommendations. The committee as a whole have shown a lot of interest and harmony and are at present going over all constitutions and other sports in the province, picking out points that they think will help the game and as well have been running all the draws and schedules of the district groups in the province.

The first Novice Tournament, in history was run this year for boys under 10 as of January 1, 1955 and the J. P. Bergin Memorial Trophy presented by Fergus Thistles in honor of a great Fergus player was won by the entry from Brampton. This trophy was presented at Fergus, September 24 during the Pee-Wee Tournament.

Arrangements for this year's Pee-Wee tournament in Fergus and Elora were conducted for the O.L.A. Minor Committee by District Convener Harris Steele of Fergus. This year was the 10th Annual Provincial Wide tournament.

The first tournament was held in Mimico and New Toronto in 1946. The Pee-Wee age group is between 10 and 12 with players not having attained 12 years of age by January 1st in year they are competing. Past winners have been 1946 Toronto St. Vincents, 1947 Brampton Excelsiors, 1948 Port Dalhousie, 1949 Fergus Thistles, 1950 Oshweken Six Nation Indians, 1951-52 Port Dalhousie, 1953 Oshweken Six Nation Indians, 1954 Peterborough Timberrmen.

Cities, towns and villages entered for this year's tournament included: Acton, Peterborough, Long Branch, Port Dalhousie, Hastings, Owen Sound, Mimico, Sarnia, Brooklin, Fergus, Brampton, Oshweken, St. Catharines, Newmarket, Alderwood, etc. Teams from Toronto, Midland and Toronto Roden Athletic club. Five games were played in Elora and all of the remainder in Fergus with all finals being held after supper in the Fergus arena.
