



The first known Christmas art, coming late in the fourth century, was by Byzantine and Italian painters.

Each differed in the conception of Christ's birthplace. The Byzantines of the east depicted the manger as a kind of grotto, set in rock and immersed in poverty. The Italians, however, saw the manger as a dirty, dilapidated shed.

By the early middle ages, Christian art progressed beyond canvas. Mosaics, frescoes, manuscripts and the miniatures beloved of the era, all lauded the coming of Christ.

Sculpture -- the infant Child, the Virgin Mother-gained in prominence among church and laymen at the turn of the 13th century. It heralded the emergence of a new art-stained glass which, superb in color and theme, became windows reflecting an image greater than
