All this is part of the holiday festivity but, unfortunately, it too often ends in tragedy. This can be prevented in many cases by the wise and thoughtful hostess.

By keeping these simple rules in mind, Mrs. Adams concluded, women can help to make this a safe and thus a happier holiday.

Federations, Co-ops Appoint Committee To Study Projects

"Care must be taken to see that a co-ordinating council does not become just another organization," warned Lloyd Acker, guest speaker at a supper meeting of the Peel, Halton and Dufferin Council of Federations and Co-operatives held at the Queen's Hotel, Brampton, on Tuesday evening, November 29. Mr. Acker, who is assistant personnel manager for United Co-operatives of Ontario, gave the group the benefit of his experience in the co-ordinating council of Lambton county last year.

Assistance can be given to all rural groups interested in promoting educational projects, with the council acting in an advisory capacity only, toward the development of greater unity of action," Mr. Acker concluded.

William Lonkie, fieldman for the Co-Op Union of Ontario, was also present at the well attended meeting. The recent radio project was evaluated and plans made for future action, the following committee being named to study all types of projects: W. H. Smellie, H. L. Davidson, Halton; Bruce Shaw, Charles Barrett, Peel; and A. McQuarrie and Wm. McCarthy, Dufferin.

Police Participate in an All-Out Drive Against Defective Vehicles

Is your car in excellent running condition? Are your lights good? Do both tail lights and brake lights work? Are your brakes, both hand and foot, good enough to stop you in an emergency? Do your windshield wipers work well in both snow and rain?

At any time of the day or night your car may be stopped by a policeman and you will be asked these questions. If you are forced to answer "no" to any of the questions, the situation will have to be remedied immediately, or you will be subject to a fine. If you can safely answer "yes," you will receive a sticker for your windshield indicating that your car has received a safety check by a Provincial Police Constable.

Town and district police are putting on an all-out effort to check every car against defects and although occasional checks have been the policy up until recently, a big drive is now being put on by all officials concerned.

Many local cars have already been checked, with fairly satisfactory results, officials state. Only a very few have been taken off the road because of defects, but more will be in the near future unless hazards are safely fixed.

Police stated that the worst fault in the cars checked was the lack of tail lights. Several cars had only one headlight, and this was pointed out as a hazard.

Officials warn that if your vehicle has not received a safety check, you should prepare for it now by putting your car or truck in the best of condition and make it a vehicle you can trust on the road.
