## Rural Safe Driving Week Launched Through Ontario

The Halton Federation of Agric + ulture announced this week that there are now 15 essays received in the essay-writing contest in conjunction with Rural Safe Driving Week, which is sponsored by the Ontario Federation of Agriculture. Rural safe driving week is February 20 to 25 and is endorsed by the Ontario Provincial Government, in an intensified effort to help reduce the alarming death toll from auto accidents in rural areas.

The award for the farm forum presenting the best essay on Safe Driving will be given at an Awards Night at Fairview school. Lowville, on Monday, February 20. This contest was sponsored by the local Federation. Special speakers for the event will be Ontario Provincial Police officials and a film on Safe Driving will be a part of the program. 
