

Sunshine School Has Five Pupils

Milton's Sunshine School for the retarded children of Milton and the surrounding district has now grown to five students. It was announced this week. The last student to start classes comes from Acton.

Plans are now being made to have the school open all day instead of just a half day as in the past. There would be three full-day pupils and two half-day children under the new system.

Saturday was Sunshine Day in Milton, as girls, most of them members of the girl guides and brownies, canvassed part of the town for funds for the Sunshine school. They sold tickets for a lucky draw to be held soon, and realized \$137 for their efforts. The rest of the town will be canvassed soon.

B.C. Group Adopt Health Principles Of South African

Duncan, B.C. (CP) - Maintaining good health through nature's principles is the object of a group operating a beautiful old estate four miles southwest of here.

The Vancouver Island Organic Co-operative association is founded on the principles outlined by Martin Pretorius, South African diet expert.

Pretorius became interested in health through nature when he learned Zulu natives had no tooth trouble. To learn the reason, he and his party lived among the natives for weeks, eating their food and emulating their habits.

The food proved too harsh, but the experiment demonstrated to them that living as close to nature as possible benefited health.

Moving spirit behind the movement here is J. R. Archer, who says he has proved the value of organic methods of farming on a small scale.

Members believe the soil holds the secret of health, producing disease-free crops rich in essential minerals. No chemical fertilizer or insect sprays are used.

Diet and preparation of food also comes as close to nature as possible. Meals consist of one serving of protein and one of carbohydrate, amounting to 20 per cent by weight. Remaining portion is fruits and vegetables.

Food is cooked only long enough to soften fibres. Waterless cooking in a partial vacuum for short periods is considered best, as it doesn't destroy vitamins and minerals.

Trafalgar to Study Cemeteries; Appoint H. Wilson Inspector

Five 80-acre cemeteries would be required in Trafalgar township when Oakville, Trafalgar, Bromley and Milton are fully developed, indicated Murray Inkster, chairman of the Trafalgar Planning Board, when he addressed Trafalgar council Monday.

He predicted a population of 400,000 for the area when the four centres are developed. Council authorized councillor Alex Phillips and Mr. Inkster to discuss the cemetery question with the Ontario Department of Health and to report at the next meeting of council on their findings.

Sergeant Harry Wilson of the Trafalgar township police was promoted to Inspector at the meeting. This promotion was made when Police Chief Fred O'Leary recommended that he be appointed. He is the first inspector in Halton county.
