New Site Chosen For Bronte Dial Office

The dial telephone building serving the Bronte district will take shape north of the village limits, some 1,200 feet south of the Queen Elizabeth Way, on the west side of the second line, on property purchased by the Bell Telephone Company from R. P. Bowen.

While just after the war Bronte phones totalled 280, today the number exceeds 800, says George W. Harris, district Bell manager.

"We foresee a tremendous growth in this community," Mr. Harris said. "That is why we have decided to locate the Bronte dial exchange building on Trafalgar St., south of the Queen Elizabeth Way, and some distance north of a site previously selected."

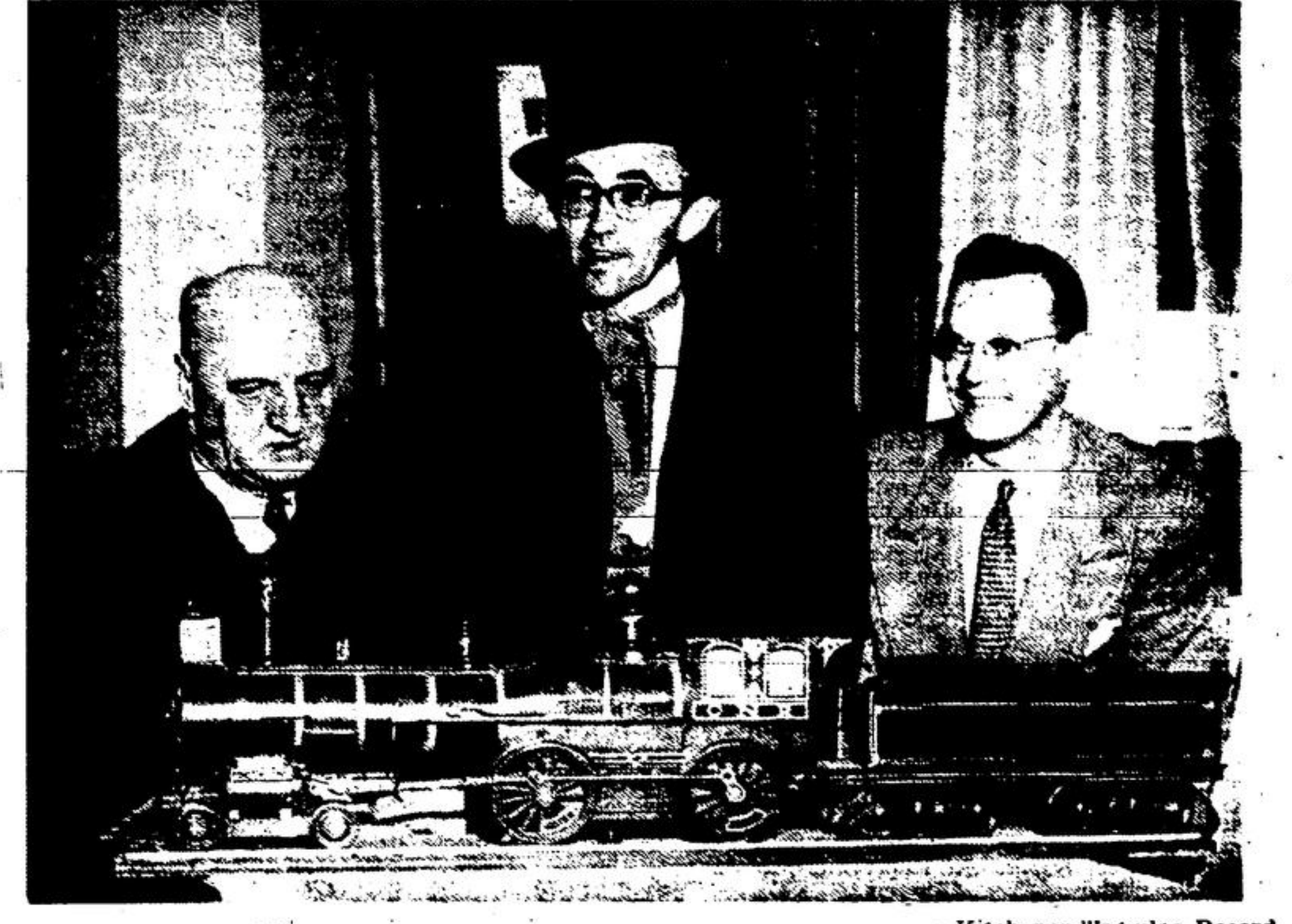

District Editors Look Back 50 Years

Newspapermen representing most smaller communities in this part of the province combined business with pleasure recently when the 50th anniversary of the Western Ontario Weekly Newspapers' Association was marked in Kitchener.

It was a day of reminiscences, speeches, forums and humorous recollections about, by and for printers and publishers of this area.

Fergus News-Record editor, Dr. H. Templin recalled the early times and growth of the association. He drew comparisons in newspapermen's terms to illustrate the changes over the half-century, and later introduced the only original member of the W.O.W.N.A. at the meeting, R. E. Ellis of Elora. The organization was formed in Palmerston.

Dr. Templin, former president of the C.W.N.A., concluded that the association, organized to open better understanding of publishers' problems, now sees better days for its member than 50 years ago.

Top-Hatted Editor

Graphic recollection of the life and times of district editors 50 years ago was presented by Palmerston Observer editor Arthur Carr, who appeared dressed in silk topper, cut-away coat, stiff collar with Ascot tie and striped trousers.

The convention was under the chairmanship of association president George Ellis, editor of the Goderich Signal-Star.

Another guest speaker was Prof. J. L. Wild of the University of Western Ontario's school of journalism, who warned the editors that they must be prepared to produce newspapers which would pace the trend to a more highly educated public.

A more critical audience is growing among newspaper readers, the speaker said, and stressed that while weeklies have maintained reliability in news presentation, they must be prepared to add zest to their product.

Speeches and Forum

The former warden of Waterloo county, H. L. (Lefty) Weichel of Elmira, entertained the group with a humorous speech after the fashion of soap-box orators 50 years ago.

C.N.R. public relations representative John Niel, Toronto, also spoke briefly. He displayed a model of an early Canadian steam locomotive and talked of the C.N.R.'s financial position from the public point of view.

Toward the close of the meeting, members participated in an open forum on production and shop planning conducted by David Dills of Acton.

Greetings to the Association were extended by C.W.N.A. president John Vopni, Davidson, Sask., Ontario association managing director Warden Leavens, Bolton, and Kitchener-Waterloo Record publisher John Motz.
