Three Growers Fined For Act Violations Three convictions under the Plant Diseases Act were registered in magistrate's courts at Orangeville and Uxbridge recently. Each case dealt with regulations respecting bacterial ring rot in potatoes, and fines of \$25 each and costs were paid by three potato growers, reports the Field Crops Branch, Ontario Department of Agriculture. The charges involved failing to dispose of potatoes found infected with bacterial ring rot in 1953, by January 31, 1956; failing to label containers for same as "Table Stock Only"; failing to report sales and failing to disinfect premises. Soon after the outbreak of the disease in Ontario about 15 years ago, potato growers organizations throughout the province requested that the industry be protected from excessive losses. Since passing of regulations in 1943, a service has been provided by the Department without charge to inspect commercial potato fields, followed by a sanitary clean-up program. Some of the similar programs have since been adopted in some other provinces and also in the U.S.A. The number of cases has been reduced from a high in Ontario of 673 in 1946 to 221 in 1955. The disease is described by plant pathologists as the most infectious and destructive seed-borne disease on the North-American continent. The use of clean seed is of prime importance in its control, but the disease may also be carried by bags, machinery, and contacts in transportation or storage.

EDEN MILLS New Pastor Holds His First Service In Historic Church Kenneth Griffiths, newly installed pastor of Eden Mills United Church, conducted his first service in this historic stone building on Sunday, July 1. His sermon was built around the ninth verse in the second chapter of Paul's letters to the Corinthians. Though a comparatively young man, Mr. Griffiths has already lived a very full life. Having served in the Royal Air Force in the last war, for five years he was a prisoner of war behind barbed wire. In his sermon on Sunday, he mentioned an experience of a fellow prisoner that had greatly affected him, using it to illustrate, a point and giving his story a most realistic touch. Though the congregation on Sunday was small, it is hoped it will steadily grow. A few staunch members of the church have feared for a long time that the church might be closed. Mr. Griffiths expressed a wish from the pulpit that each person in the congregation would return next Sunday and bring someone with him. A sincere man and gifted speaker, Mr. Griffiths' appointment is welcomed by Eden Mills as well as the two other churches under his care, Arkell and Ebenezer. Service in Eden Mills is at two o'clock on Sunday afternoons. The United Church is on Cedar St. back of Coulson's store.
