Of the millions of square miles on this continent, a very small area is covered by natural gas fields.

The discovery of natural gas would be of little value if it were not for the transmission lines -- safe, rapid and economical transportation of natural gas over great distances to growing municipalities and bustling industrial centres.

Over a quarter - million miles of underground 'railroads' -- mammoth subway transportation systems -- transmit natural gas to an increasing number of towns and cities, erasing from the sky over these communities the smoke and smudge of raw fuels, saving citizens untold billions of dollars in terms of improved health, cleaner buildings, clothing and purer air. Natural gas, after being stored for millions of years, is being restored to men, granting him freedom from dirt, freedom from disease, freedom from hunger, freedom from discomfort and freedom from labour.

Through the miracle of transmission, over 54 million persons are benefitted directly by natural gas; counting the products distributed by industrial plants using natural gas, these benefits reach every citizen on this continent and millions more around the world.
