MOSTLY WAGES

STEEL PRICES are not simply the aggregate of costs in a steel mill. Others also get paid, including those who work in iron mines, coal mines, limestone quarries, on railways, steamships, motor trucks, in sales offices, and elsewhere. In fact, all prices are mostly wages and salaries.

So there is an upward pressure on prices with every increase in wages, though investment in better equipment does help to absorb such wage increases.

No one can afford to be indifferent to rising industrial wage costs, for these tend to lead to higher prices. As users of steel in many forms, all farmers in particular are adversely affected when higher city wages raise production costs and selling prices.
