### Girls' Pipe Band at Detroit Band Tattoo

The Georgetown Girls' Pipe Band were in Detroit recently as part of a mass band tattoo and Highland Games presented by the St. Andrew's Society of Detroit.

The girls joined 23 other bands, brass, bugle and pipe, in the University of Detroit stadium for the tattoo and later a parade in the downtown section of the city.

In the stadium, 700 pipers and drummers gathered to fill the air with the stirring strains of Scottish marches and take part in the Highland games and band competitions. The Georgetown girls did not compete.

Of the 23 bands at the meet, 19 were from Canada. The four American bands in attendance were all pipe bands, one each from Flint and Ridgeway and two from the host city.

A Highland ball Saturday night wound up the meet, the largest ever staged in Detroit. Due to a very crammed schedule the girls had little time to take in the points of interest of the metropolis and had to confine their tour of the town to the parade route.

### Georgetown Building Slack This Summer

Building continues slack in Georgetown this summer.

In August, permits were issued for only two new houses, plus a number of alterations and repairs, and total value was only \$42,583 according to a report compiled by building inspector Harold Campbell.

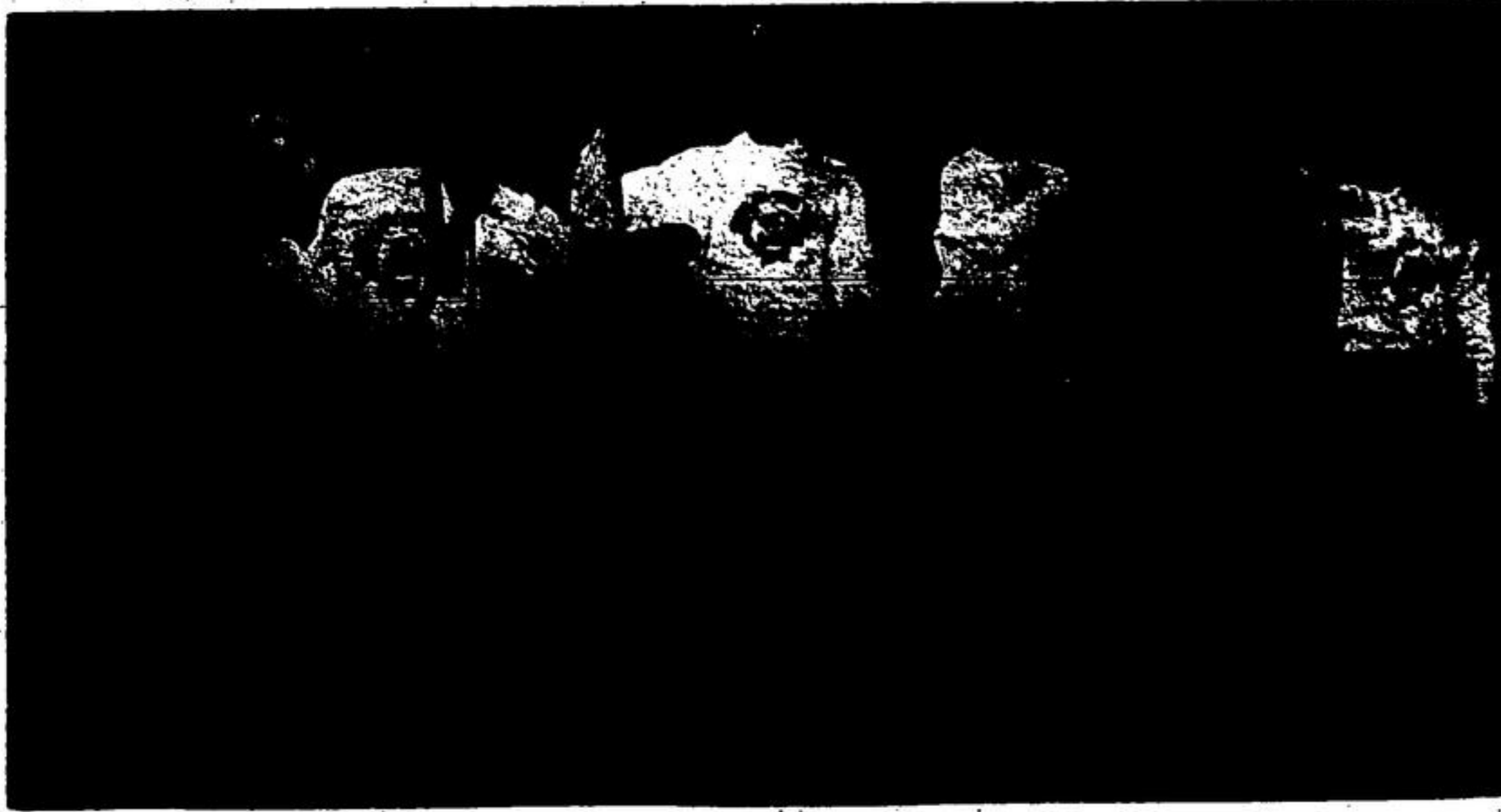

### Near 400 Teachers Responsible For Instructing Halton Pupils

Nearly 400 teachers have returned to their Halton classrooms this month to begin their task of instructing the county's school pupils, according to figures released from the office of Halton Inspector L. L. Skuce. Complete figures for enrolment have not yet been tabulated, but it is expected that at the end of September, all of Halton's teachers will submit enrolment totals to the inspectors' office. This year there are three public school inspectors.

One indication, however, of the increase in enrolment over last year was given in Trafalgar township, where this month's enrolment of 2,439 struggling scholars is a 20 per cent. increase over the number who left the township's schools last year. Trafalgar's school board Monday evening discussed plans for the erection of five new public schools.

Helping to cope with the increased attendance throughout the county is the opening of new schools and additions. In Trafalgar, two rooms have been added to the L. L. Skuce school; two others, the E. A. Orr school and the Snyder's school have been opened; the new Morden school is not yet ready for occupation and the Pinegrove school is still under construction. In addition, the township of Trafalgar is making plans for building two new schools on Oakville's outskirts.

In Burlington, the new Wellington Square school, consisting of 14 rooms, has been opened since June. Nelson township's Clarksdale school has received a four-room addition and the Fairview school boasts three additional rooms.

A new 12 room-unit in Georgetown, named the Harrison school, is still under construction. In the meantime, pupils are working in staggered hours at the Wrigglesworth school.

In Acton, plans are completed and tenders are being called for the

six room M. Z. Bennett school. The village of Bronte is planning a new school and the school board is now in the process of engaging an architect. A four room separate school is nearing completion there. In Trafalgar, about four rooms of a new separate school are now in use. And plans are surging ahead now on the new eight room school for Milton's north end.

In area of fresh water, Canada's five leading provinces are Ontario, Quebec, Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Newfoundland.
