## High Y's Men Post Given G. McKenzie

G. W. McKenzie has been appointed lieutenant director for Ontario Y's Men's clubs. The announcement, made at the regional conference in Belleville last week-end, came as a complete surprise to the delegation of 25 from Acton.

The group filled one table and, as the club with the highest attendance, won the shield donated by Mr. McKenzie himself.

Former district governor, he is now the right hand man for the Ontario director, William Gauld of London. Since Mr. Gauld has just been moved temporarily to Winnipeg, extra duties are already falling on the Acton man very shortly after the honor was conferred. The two supervise and direct clubs throughout the province. There are presently 32 and six more are being formed.

The next conference, at the same time next year, will be held at Geneva Park with the Acton club as hosts.

The international convention is being held next July in Toronto, and Acton ladies are already making plans. Mr. McKenzie heads a committee selecting speakers for this convention and reports outstanding men such as John Fisher already have agreed to be there.

## 800 Auxiliary Members March

Three Acton delegates attended the 27th Provincial Command, Legion Ladies' Auxiliary, in London, Mrs. R. Finlay, Mrs. E. Ford and Mrs. J. Buchanan. Many items of interest were dealt with during the four days. There was a donation of \$500 to the Westminster hospital in London. This is the only hospital in Ontario for the psychiatric care of returned veterans. \$1,000 was given for the Book and Education Fund which helps those who are still in the service.

After a full day's session on Wednesday, there was a parade to the cenotaph and memorial service. Over 800 women were on parade, all wearing grey skirts and navy blazers with berets. This is the largest parade they ever had.

The next convention, two years from now, will be held in Toronto at the Royal York hotel. The Auxiliaries are expanding so rapidly that there are not many cities that can handle the convention any more. There were over 700 women from all parts of Ontario, most of whom were accommodated in the Hotel London. The Regent Room in the hotel was not quite adequate for 700 delegates.
