## Building Sold Use Not Known

Mayor Tyler confirmed this week he had been informed use of a commercial property on Main St. north had been completed. The building, owned by E. Hulton, has been vacant for some time.

The Mayor, chairman of the industrial committee of council, had not been informed by the prospective purchasers, what type of operation they would conduct, when they visited town earlier.

It is not known here whether the property will be used in light manufacturing or as a commercial retail outlet.

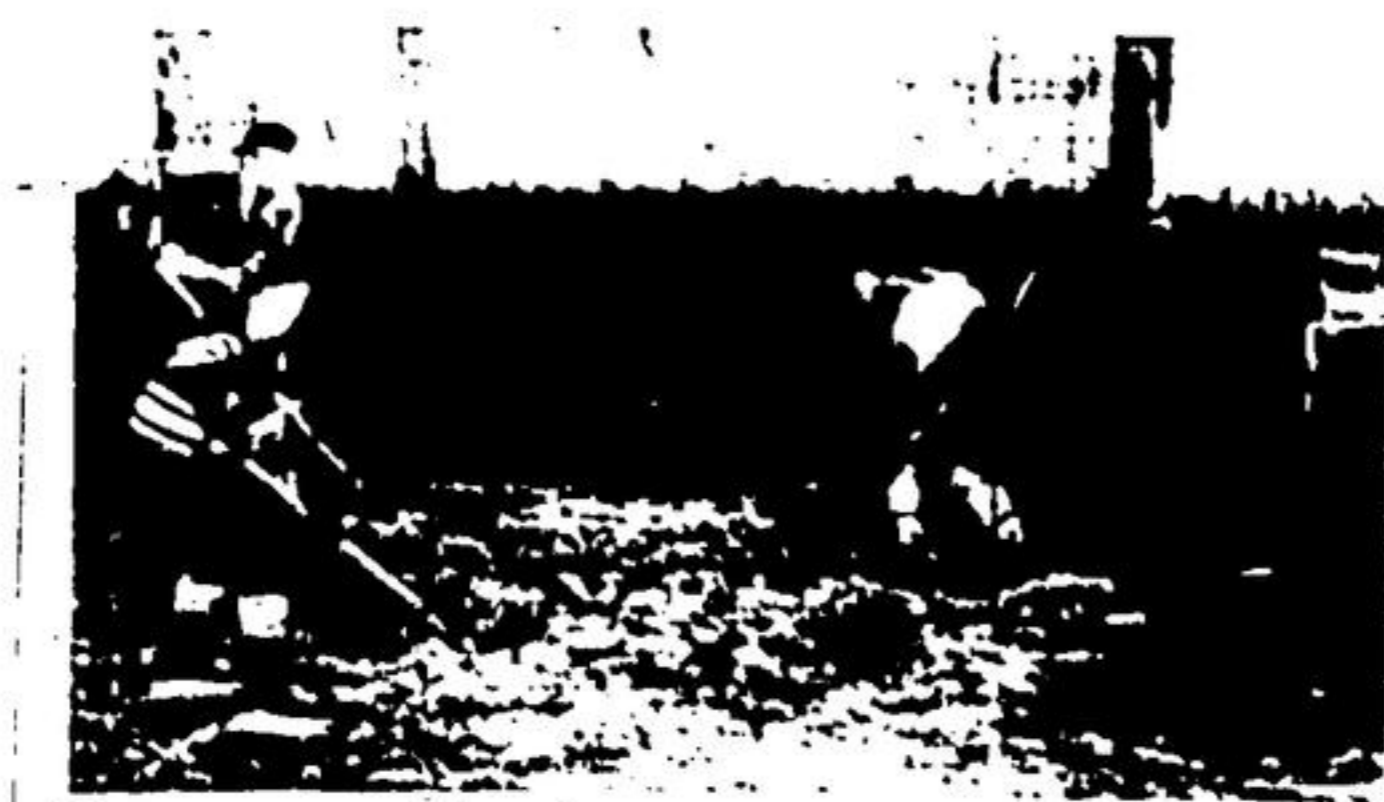

### Jr. Raiders Need Overtime As Locals Set Fast Pace

Playing minus four regulars, Acton Juniors nevertheless gave Georgetown's Junior Raiders a lesson in hockey for three periods in Acton arena last Friday night before bowing to the visitors in overtime. The teams were tied heading into extra time at 4 all and the hand pass they set for the Junior Raiders had a telling effect on the locals as they faded badly in overtime allowing Georgetown to pop in four goals and skate off with an 8-4 decision.

The second period Raiders had an uphill battle all the way in front of the largest crowd to sit in at a Junior game here this season. They never gained the lead until the overtime session when the Acton crew was so tired they could hardly stand on their skates.

Charlton started the Junior Raiders off on extra time at the two-minute mark completing a three-man play with Beckett and Thompson. This time the puck out of their own end was futile and at the seven-minute mark Cunningham gave the visitors a goal cushion.

With two minutes the Raiders had two goals leading to a four goal edge within 10 minutes.

Overtime was in startling contrast to play in regular time when the locals with the line of Bob Coxie, flanked by Arbie and Black, spearheaded a strong offensive. Coxie opened the scoring early in the first chapter, banging in Arbie's rebound after sealing the puck at the Georgetown blue line. The Junior Raiders squawked that the goal was offside but neither referee saw it.

Disorganized by the ineffectual Acton checking, Georgetown, finally clicked at the 15 minute mark when Hart tried the equalizer into the Regina.

The second stanza had barely begun when Paul Lawson broke into the clear, drew the goalie out, and Harvey Black finished the play off to give Acton a 2-1 lead. It stayed that way until midway through the period when Charlton notched the first of two goals he notched in the night, making it 2-all.

With Debbie in the visitors' off, Black nearly gave Acton the lead but Marshall was one of the better Acton players as the locals lost.
