NORVAL - The village marked an historic day on APRIL 18 when the post office, which had been in one location since about 1840, moved to a new site.

The change was necessitated by alterations being made to the former Barnhill General Store by Wilfred Kirkwood who purchased it last fall and is moving his entire merchandising operations in the new location.

The post office is temporarily located in Fendley's Store. Members of the Barnhill family have been postmasters since 1880. The position was first held by Wm J. Barnhill, later by his brother, E. H. Barnhill and latterly by Harry Barnhill, son of E. H., who was the last proprietor.
