\$200,000 a Week In Bank Bonfire - And It's Real

PORT ARTHUR (Ont. C.P.) The banks here have money to burn but they don't burn it themselves. Each week the chartered banks in this Lakehead centre send diluted bank notes to Ottawa in lots of \$100,000. The money is then shovelled into an incinerator and goes up in smoke. Bank managers estimate that a \$1 bill goes into circulation five times before it's either torn or spoiled and given a one-way trip to the ashbin. They say it takes anywhere from

one week to one year for a bill to get in this condition, the length of time depending on the area in which the money is used. In mining districts, money gets grime and torn quickly. In the retail trade a bill may last for a full year. Banking officials place the average life of a dollar bill at eight months. Spoiled currency taken out of circulation is shipped to the Bank of Canada in Ottawa, which catalogues the serial number on each bill then burns the bill, which is replaced with a crisp, new one. Banking officials say that a bill put into circulation at Atkagan, for instance, will not last as long as one put into circulation at the

Lakehead. There are various reasons for a bill's early withdrawal. One that winds up in a dice game, for example, takes an unusually long beating. Bank managers use their own judgment when to take a bill out of circulation. One manager recalled receiving a letter from his president complaining that he was taking bills out of circulation too early. "One would think," the letter said, "that the letter would be ladies and scented exquisites. A real man is like a good watch.
