

### Rev. G. L. Royal Guest Speaker For Decoration Day Sunday

Rev. G. Lockhart Royal of Norval will be the guest speaker at the main part of the Decoration Day service this Sunday at Fairview cemetery. In the event of rain, the service will be held in Acton United church.

Local organizations have again planned Decoration Day and have had a community picnic. Not only will graves of servicemen and ex-servicemen be decorated, but everyone is invited to bring flowers of any kind to place on the graves of relatives and friends. Flower money will be raised, as well as Fairview and St. Joseph's cemeteries.

Members of Acton organizations will march from the station to the cemetery on Mill St. and from there to Fairview cemetery. Assembly time at the C.I.E. station is 1:30 p.m. and parade time, 2:15 p.m. The parade is divided into three parts, each under a marshal with a band.

Group One, under marshal Gordon Beatty, comprises Acton Citizens Band, Mayor and Council, Acton Fire Fighters' Association, Acton Boy Scouts and Cubs and the color party.

Group Two, under marshal Dr. A. J. Buchanan, comprises Guelph Pipe Band, the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Canadian Legion, the Duke of Devonshire and Lakeside Chapters, I.O.G.E., Women's Institute and the Girl Guides and Brownies.

Group Three, under marshal Victor Patrick, comprises the Guelph Sea Cadet Band, The Acton Branch of the Canadian Legion with of the visiting branches of this group.

The parade halts at the cemetery and proceeds to Fairview cemetery for a service there.

### Dedicate Park Plaque To Honor Pioneers

The descendants of Edward Griffin, who in 1869 felled the first tree in a little town that is presently known as Smithville, in the St. Catharines area, have erected a bronze plaque on a cairn to perpetuate the pioneer name.

The cairn is built of stones gathered from the original Griffin crown land.

Eighty year old Smith Griffin of Acton unveiled the plaque and Rev. George Griffin of Peterborough, assisted by Rev. J. E. Bole, dedicated it.
