Acton Cubs Win Honors At 2nd District Cubaree

Acton Wolf Cubs were again among the top four Cub Packs in the North Halton District as they took two of the top four positions in the second District Cubaree held last Saturday afternoon in Milton.

The Second Georgetown Pack, under the guidance of Cubmaster Jim Schofield, led the other ten entries all the way but were matched almost point for point by Acton's "B" Pack, which finished in the runner-up spot. Second Georgetown is the newest of the groups to join the North Halton District and was the first time that the pack had entered any competition.

Acton "B" Pack, who repeated as second place winners again this year, was coached by assistant cubmasters Doris Allan and Lorne Young.

Fishing in a solid third place was the First Glen Williams pack, another new group in the North Halton District this year. Assistant cubmasters Billie Young and June Gunn coached the Glen Williams group.
