But it is important to remember that when a lawn is watered, should get a thorough soaking, rather than a light sprinkling. A light application of water soon evaporates, but its worst fault is that it tends to encourage shallow rooting of the grass, and at the same time, confers its greatest benefit on surface-cooting weeds, such as crab

To gauge the correct amount of water to apply to a lawn at one time, place a pan in the area covered by the lawn sprinkler. Then half of water in the pan, that area of the lawn has received enough water and the sprinkler may be moved to another location.
