Rhiley Anderson of Churchill, and Mr. Doug Copeland of Acton all sang several numbers which were very well received.

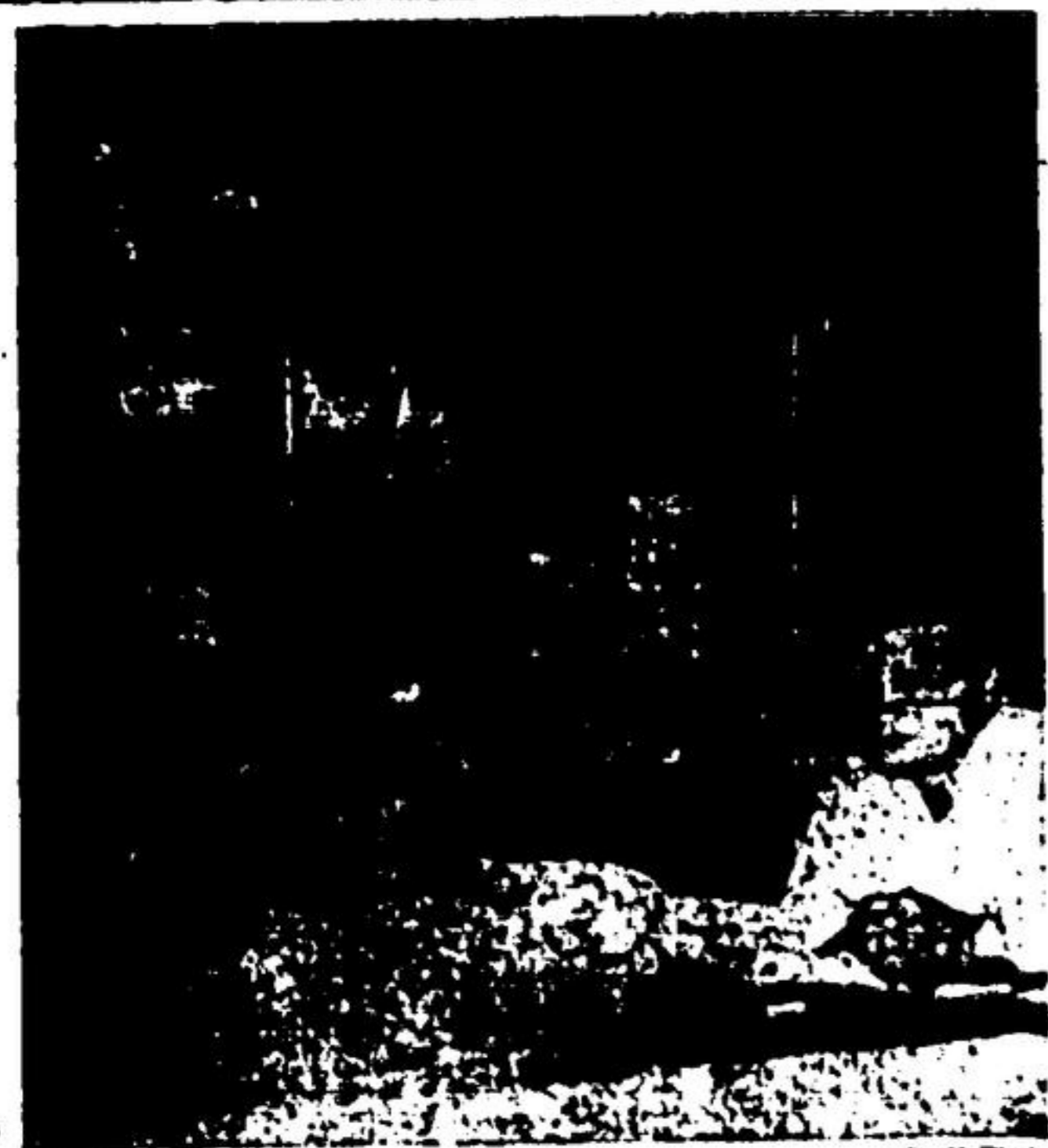
Mr. Charles Landborough gave several concert solos accompanied by his daughter Helen who later ably played a piano.
