

Ashgrove Exhibitor Wins Award 167 Entries Paraded Before Judge

Twenty-seven Halton Holstein exhibitors paraded 167 entries for Judge Ralph Dunton of Brampton. R. C. Alexander of Ashgrove duplicated his achievement of a year ago by winning the premier exhibitor and breeder awards.

Miss Barbara Y. Royle of Oakville was the runner-up for the premier exhibitor award; and Ashville Farms Ltd. (Pelletier Bros.) took the reserve premier breeder award. Wilfred Leslie and Sons of Georgetown had the grand champion male of the show in their winning two year old, Spring Farm Ford Pebe.

G. Howard Gowland of Milton won the reserve grand champion in his winning male yearling, Sheffield Supreme Chic. Both bulls won their respective classes at the Canadian National Exhibition, and the former bull was also grand champion at the C.N.E.

In the females, Barbara Royle showed the way, taking both senior and both grand champion awards. The grand champion female was the winning mature cow in milk, Twin Rivers Sovereign Kate—her dam, Darkie Pabel Reflection, the winning mature dry cow, took the reserve honors.

Eight members of the Halton Jersey Club with 107 entries staged one of the classiest shows for Judge Norman Bagg of Thornhill that Milton has ever seen—and that is saying a good deal. Following the placing of a ring of 16 senior calves, Judge Bagg was overheard to remark, "The top five entries in that class are good enough for any show in Canada."

The Lindale herd of Maurice C. Beaty, which recently tied for the Premier Breeder Award at the Canadian National Exhibition, repeated by capturing both Premier exhibitor and Premier breeder awards.

Mr. and Mrs. M. W. Staples won the grand champion male award on their winning yearling, Beacon's Basil 4L, with Geo. Hewer's Brampton Lucret Radar, the senior champion male, getting the nod for reserve grand honors over Ken Ella and Sons' winning senior calf and reserve junior champion male, Rock Ella Daisy Boy.

In the female section of the show, Mac Alexander and Sons had their winning senior calf, Campbell Wanda Generation, captured the junior female championship award over Maurice Beaty's winning junior yearling, Lindale Bijou Pina Rose.

However, the senior and grand champion awards were all Lindale, with Lindale Basil Estella Lucille 4th taking both senior and grand champion awards, and the winning 3 year old in milk, Lindale Beacon Pin Rose getting the reserve senior and reserve grand awards.
