**Writer Gives Opinion Of One Way Street**

To the Editor,  
Acton Free Press.  
Dear Sir,

Speaking as an individual and as a taxpayer of Acton for about 16 years, I wish to let other taxpayers know how I feel about the one-way street signs which have been placed at the entrance to Hill Street East from the corner of Young Street.

First of all, if Hill Street East must be a one-way street, I would suggest to the powers that be that they take in only one block immediately west of the school, when school is in session, to protect the school bus. The way the sign is set now, they take in three blocks.

The following is a list of inconveniences and confusion which come from the fact that a one-way street is set up for only one block from the entrance to Hill Street East. I take it that I have to go on up Young and make a left hand turn off the highway at Hill Street to make a complete circle of one block to go to my garage. This is no simple matter.

Another suggestion I would make is that there be a one-way sign on Hill Street West to allow traffic to take the one-way street back to the school and out of the school zone. This would be a great help to the school bus and to the parents of the children who live in the school zone.
