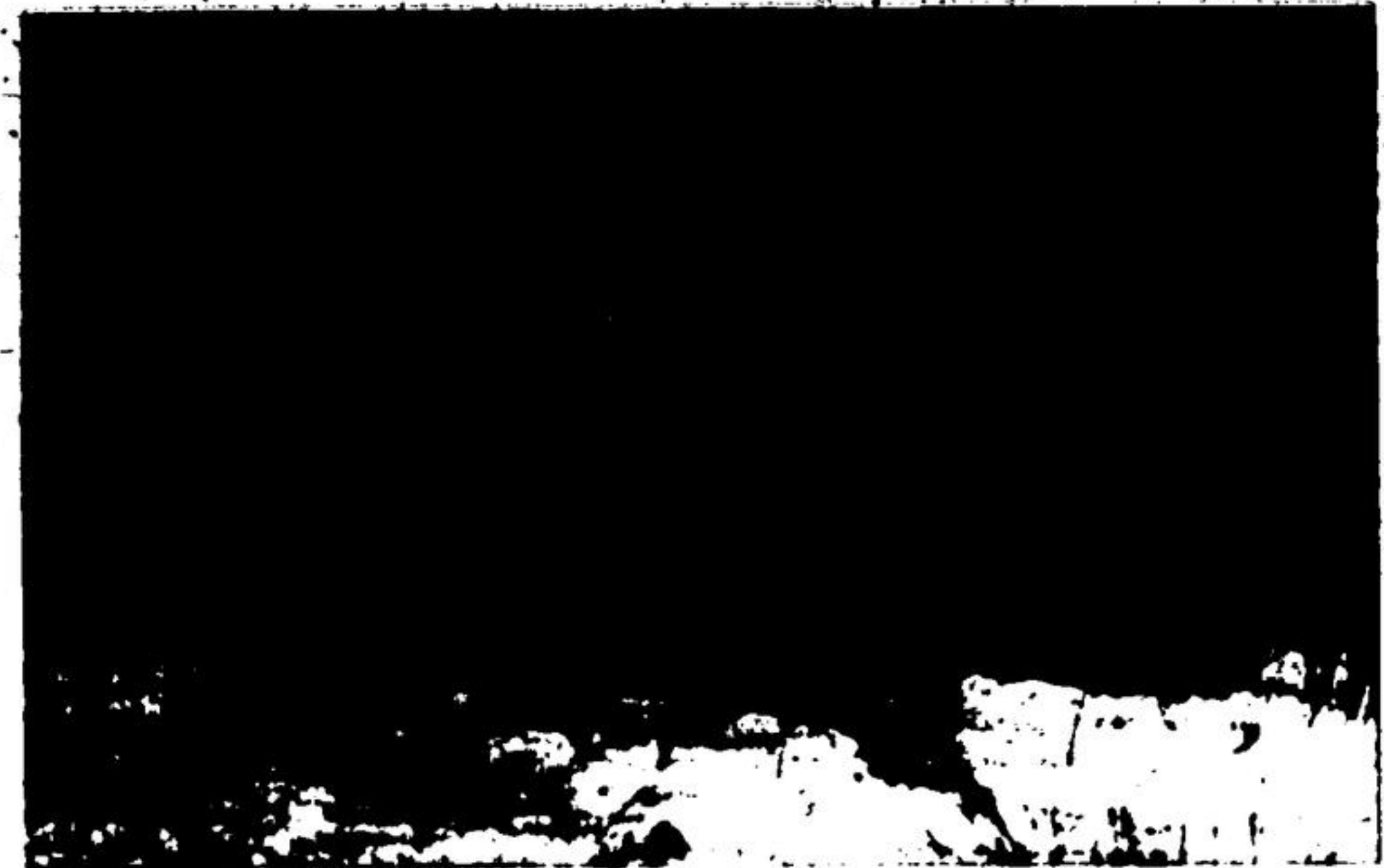
Ladger's I.G.A.
