## YEAR-LONG REMINDER

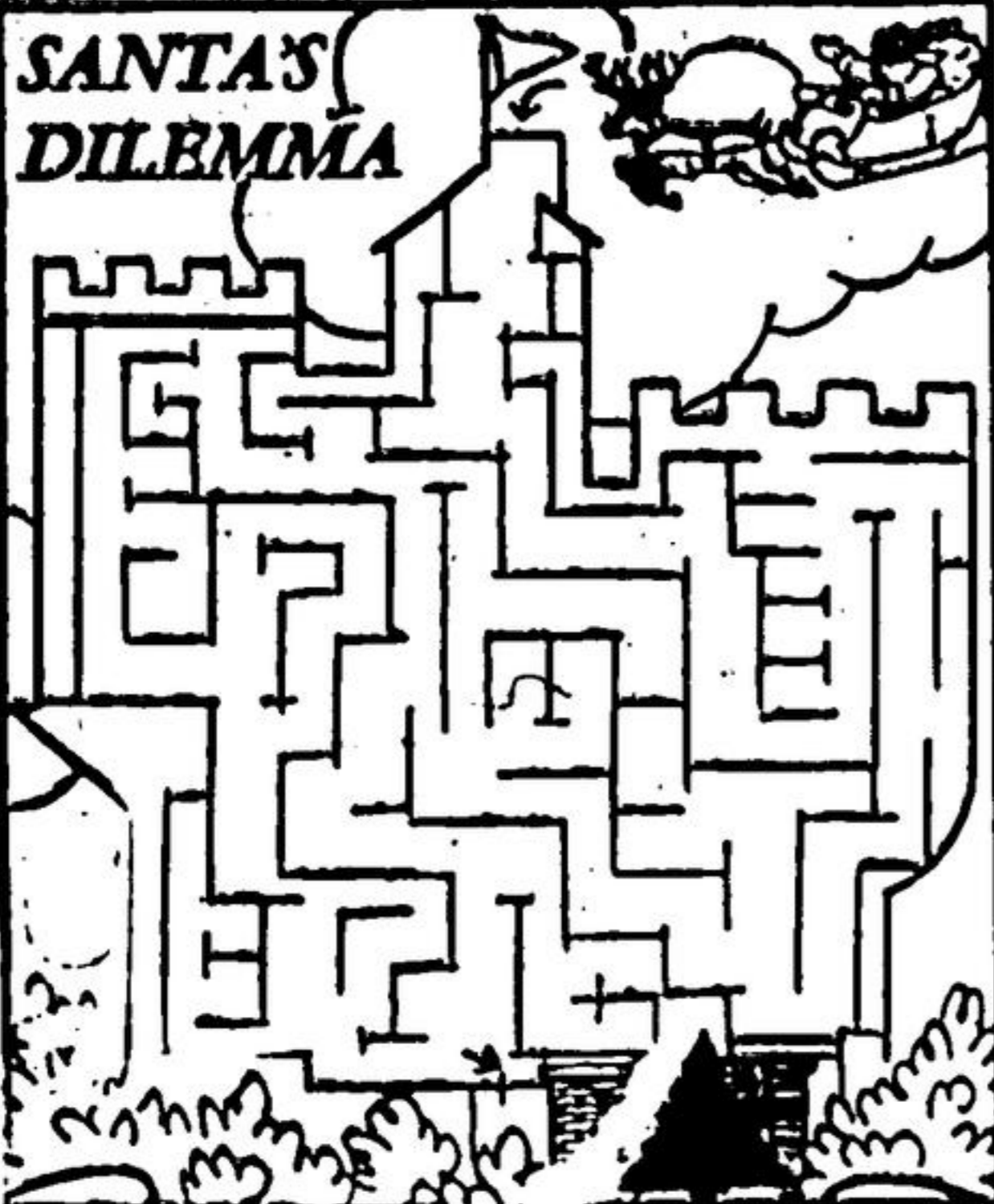
**P**UZZLING over a gift idea? A paperweight with your personal touch, to remind one of Christmas all year around is suggested.

**M**aterials: a wide-mouthed jar with built-in rubber gasket, small Christmas figurine, waterproof glue, camphor flakes.

**T**o assemble: Uncover jar cover. Glue figurine to underside of cover.

**W**hen glue is dry (note package directions), place two or three tablespoons of camphor flakes in jar and fill with water. Screw cover on tightly. Invert jar and shake. Settling camphor gives effect of snow falling about the figurine.

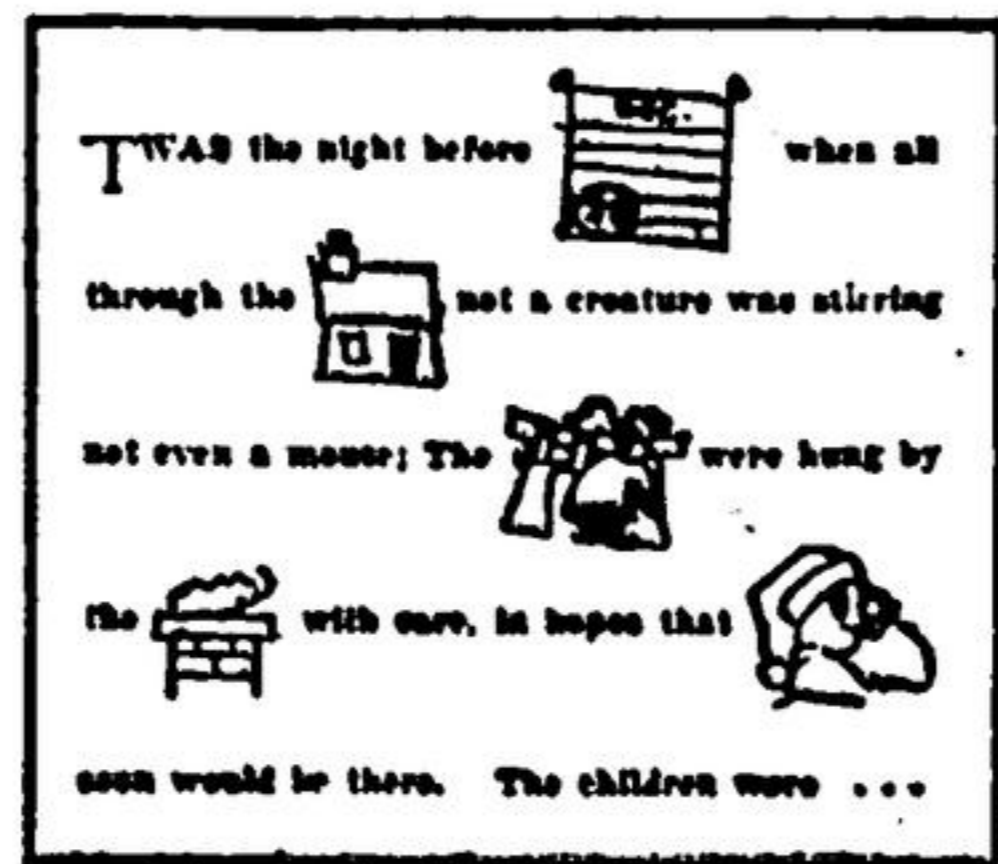
## Christmas Drawing Test

**H**ERE is a Christmas party diversion to keep the festivities at a merry clip.

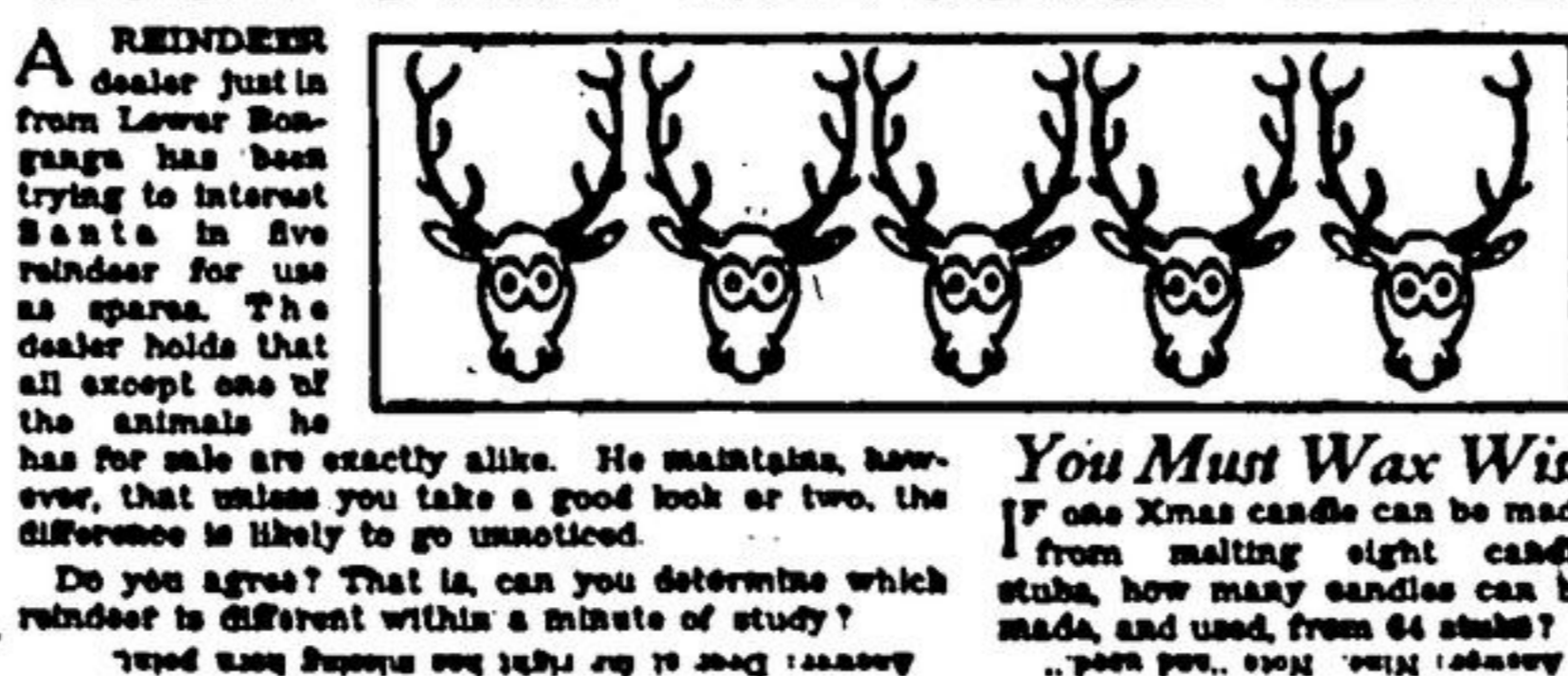

**O**bject of the game is to replace as many words as possible in the poem with rough or stick-figure drawings. For example, below, we've taken part of the poem and picked out some of the more obvious possibilities.

**P**rices are suggested for 1—most figures drawn; 2—best artist; 3—most original drawings, etc. Of course, there should be a time limit.



## LOOK OVER THE SCRUB TEAM



**A** **R**EMINDER dealer just in from Lower Bonanza has been trying to interest Santa in five reindeer for use as sparrows. The dealer holds that all except one of the animals he has for sale are exactly alike. He maintains, however, that unless you take a good look or two, the difference is likely to go unnoticed.

## You Must Wax Wise

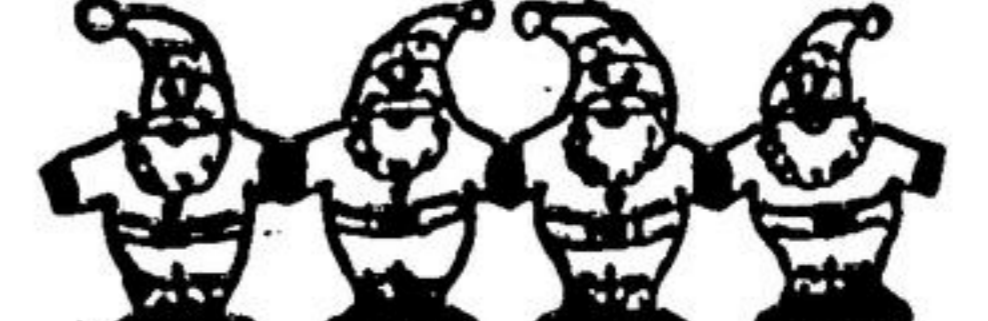
**I**f one Xmas candle can be made from melting eight candle stubs, how many candles can be made, and used, from 64 stubs?

## PLAN TO FOIL SANTA

**U**se of a pattern similar to the one at right is suggested. Instructions are given in bold-face type below it. Naturally, you'll want to add bits of construction paper and cotton to dress them up.

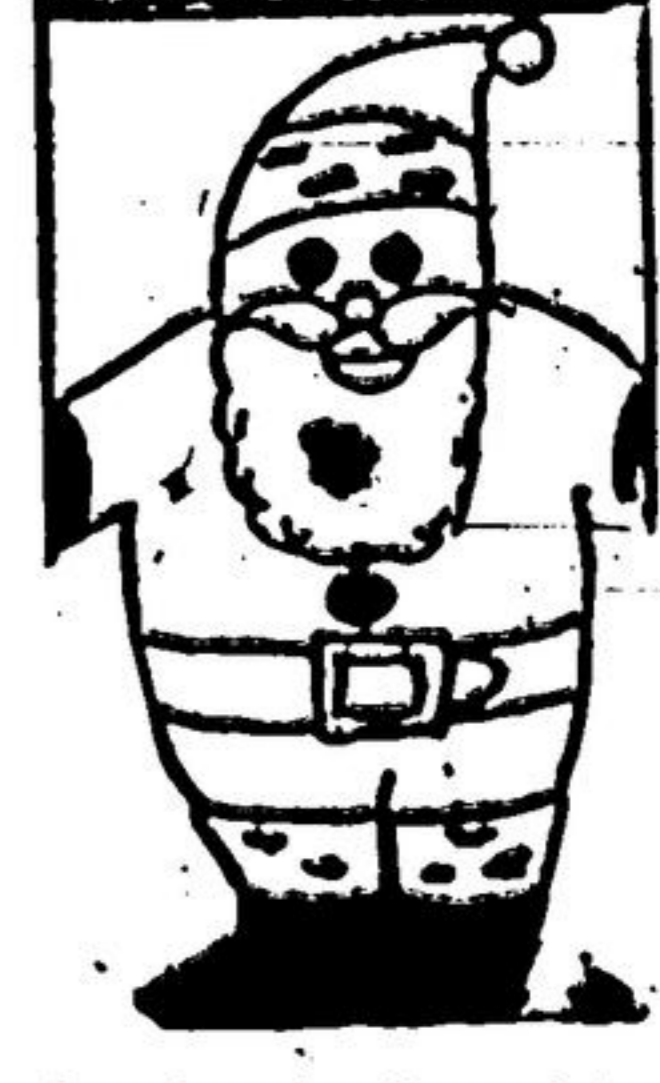

## Easy to Assemble Plaque



**Y**OU may be surprised by the ease with which you can turn an ordinary asbestos mat into an attractive Christmas wall plaque. See illustration at left.

**S**imply cover the face of the mat with a circular piece of shiny metallic gift-wrap and paste additional "snowery" thereon.

**A** small angel figurine or paper cut-out is suggested for the foreground. Cotton puff clouds and gummed silver stars complete the scene.

**T**hose who are creative may wish to think up other themes.

**O**ld magazines and Christmas cards are good places to explore such possibilities.

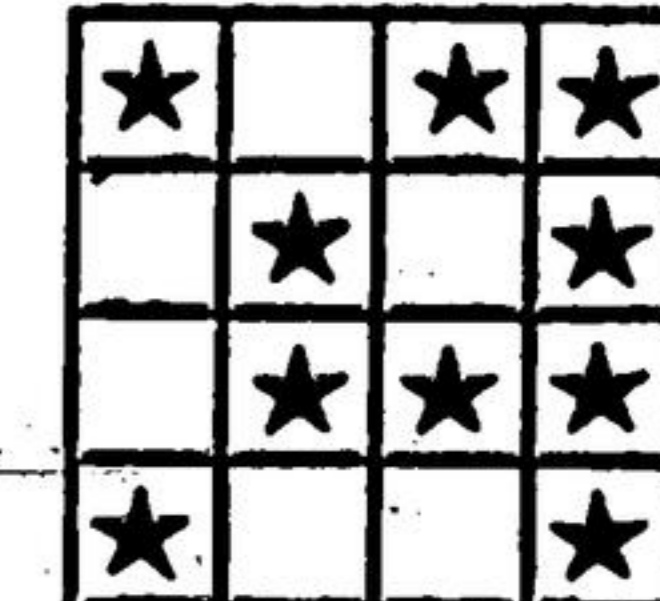
