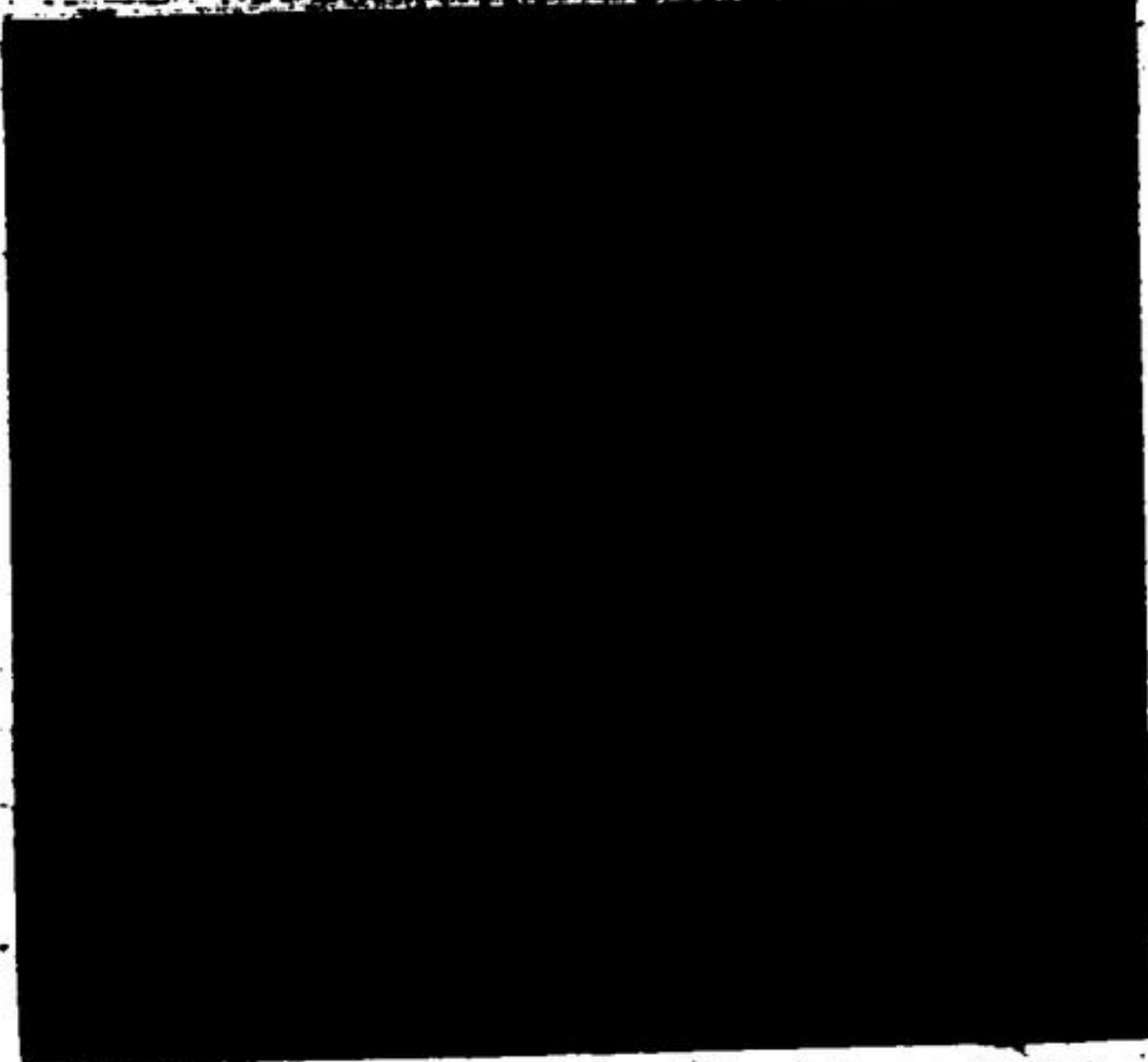
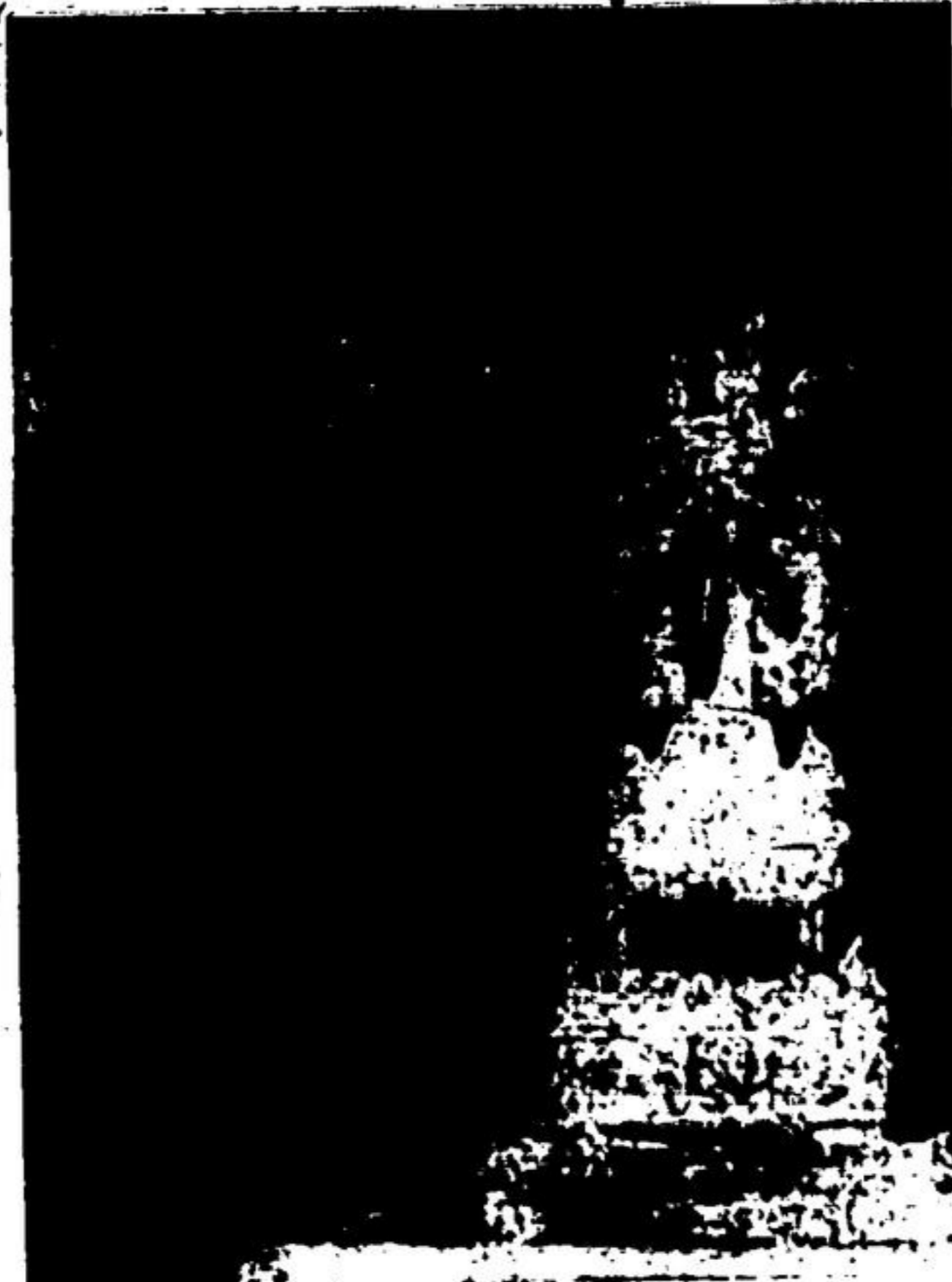


Pictures Recall People and Events of '57 Highlights, Happenings of Local Interest

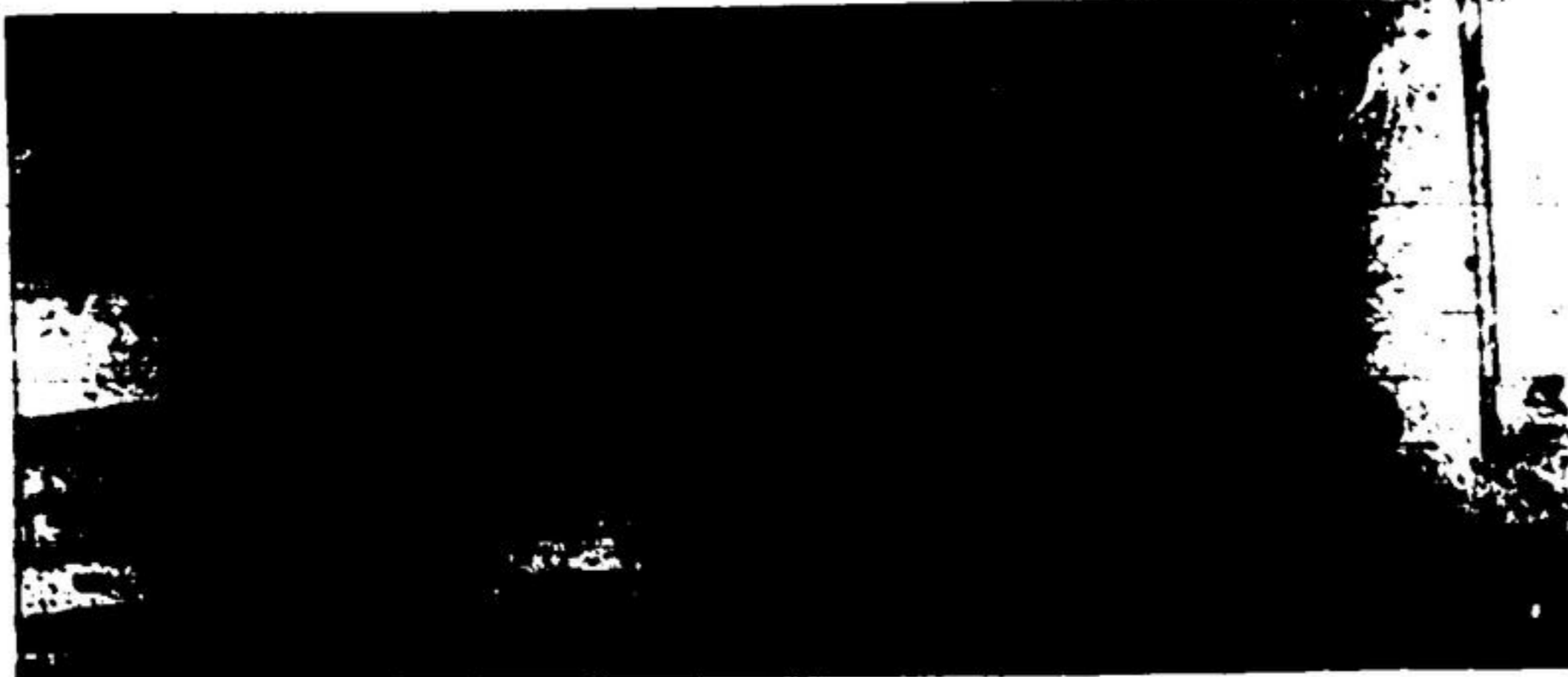

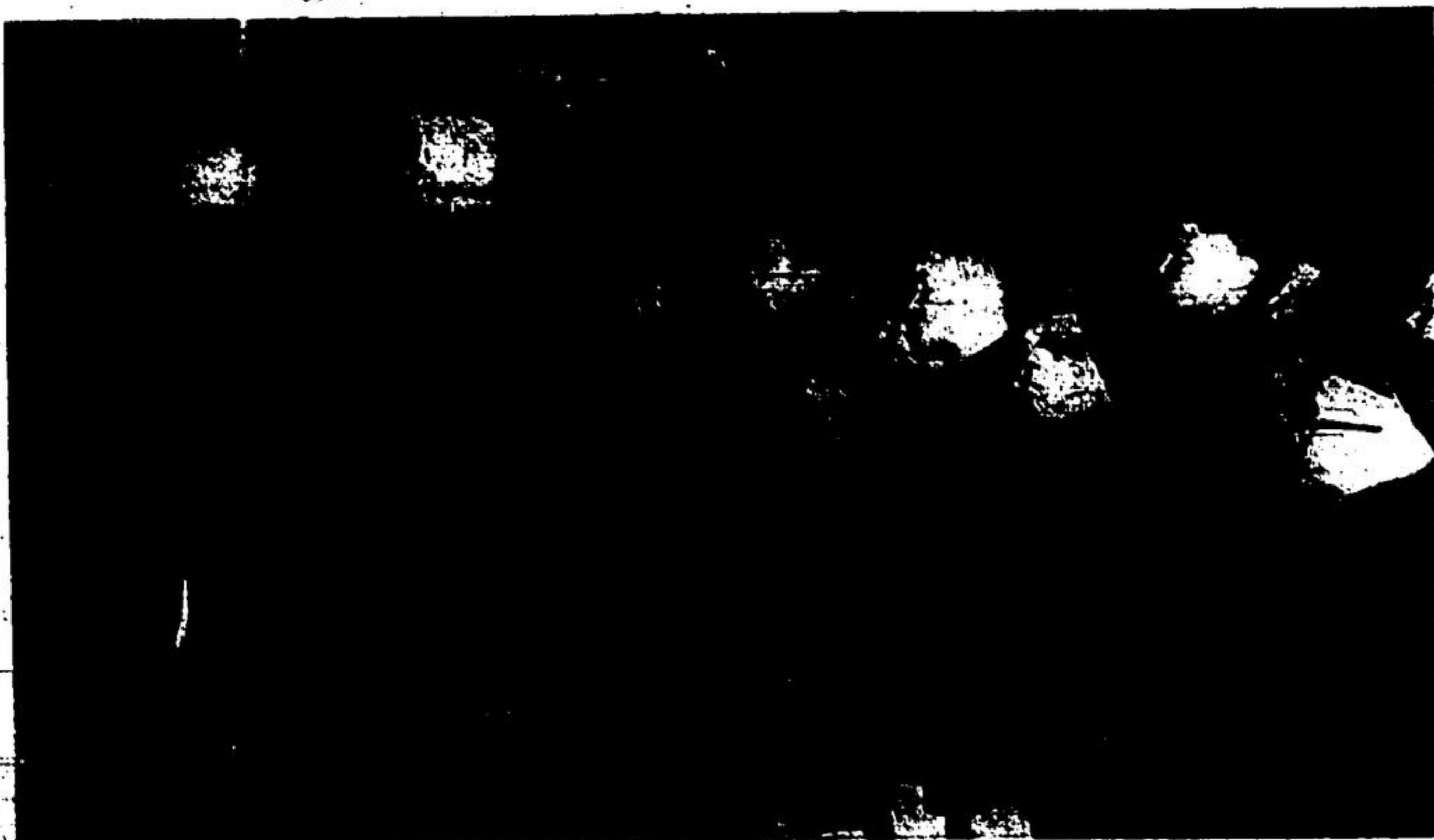
