**Board Approves Supply Budget**

Proposed operating budgets were approved by the North Halton District High School Board at their meeting Monday in Georgetown.

Members from the five northern municipalities reviewed simple budgets submitted by the Action, Milton and Georgetown principals. Budgets of \$2,600 for Georgetown, \$2,700 for Acton and \$3,000 for Milton were approved. Capital equipment in addition to these budgets was also reviewed. Among the purchases approved was a portable record player, amplifier for French television for the Action school.

Trustee Melvin Webster reported on the opening of a school site to Milton at \$1,400 an acre. Members discussed the procedure of purchasing land and the method of giving it to the participating municipalities.

A representative of Huntington Laboratories outlined the need for a new letter sorting machine at the Action High School and the advantages of using his firm's money-saving plan and supplies. The plan called for waxing three times a year with a consequent reduction in supplies, it was noted. The building committee was instructed to investigate the offer.

Trustee Niven reported on the heating system in the Milton High School. He recommended a study of previous contracts on the system since it appeared to be a "cost-plus" system. He pointed out that members were present from Acton, Nassauwax, Esquinton, Milton and Georgetown.
