Halton Debaters In Trafalgar Ontario Champs

Halton's all-girl Junior Farmer debating team which entered the provincial finals in Guelph Friday night brought the championship to Halton county for the third year in a row when they defeated the two teams from Waterloo county by a slim three-point margin.

Affirmatives Jean Bird and Mildred, Watson and negatives Jean Peterson and Barbara Cunningham were each presented with a silver tray and \$40 cash by Dave Barrie, Ontario Junior Farmer president, at the conclusion of the finals Friday night.

"Resolved that contract farming is in the best interests of the Ontario farmer" was the debate. The team took for the competition. While Halton's affirmatives whipped the Waterloo team by seven points at Massey Hall, the local negative team lost by four points to the Waterloo affirmatives, giving Halton a three-point margin of points.

Everett Biggs, Dairy Commissioner of Ontario, and Professor W. Carpenter of the English Department of the O.A.C. were the judges.

Last year, Bertha Watson, Jack Black, Howson Riddell and Bill Marshall, equipped the provincial honor for Halton, while in 1956 Roy Ford, George Greenlee, Mac Spruill and Lloyd Vixian of Halton were named champions.

Actually Halton has won honors four times in the past six years. In 1952, Earl Snow and Eleanor McKeown won the championship.

Atomic Initials Become Familiar

CHALK RIVER, Ont. (CP) — Research tools at Canada's atomic project here are better known by initials than by names.

Five sets of initials now identify the main facilities: NRX, NIU, NPD, PTH and ZEEP.

The ZEEP is a small, low-cost atomic reactor built in 1945. Its real name is Zero Energy Experimental Pile, chosen because the reactor operates on low power.

NRX stands for National Research X-metal. This is the \$4,000,000 atomic reactor which was the most powerful of its type in the world when it went into operation in 1947. It was built when the Chalk River project was operated by the National Research Council and uranium was known by the code name X-metal.

NIU is a \$26,000,000 experimental reactor expected to be in operation this fall. The initials stand for National Research Universal.

NPD stands for Nuclear Power Demonstration, the experimental atomic power plant being built by Atomic Energy of Canada Ltd., the crown agency that operates the Chalk River project, and by the Ontario Hydro-Electric Commission and Canadian General Electric Company Ltd.

PTH stands for Pool Test Reactor, a low-power unit built for \$200,000 and designed mainly for experiments in development of atomic power stations.

Town Repeals Poll Tax By-Law

BURLINGTON—Council Monday night, by a vote of 8-4, passed a by-law eliminating the \$10 annual poll tax now imposed on single young men in the town.

This action followed a discussion on the issue last week when councillor William Cunniff voiced strong objection to the by-law.

Oliver McEwan, the assessment commissioner Ernest Williams, who originally recommended that the tax be scrapped, last night gave the following reasons for his action:

● The amount collected (two per cent last year) does not warrant the time spent.

● Residents of the annexed portion of the town have never been conditioned to the tax.

● Trying to collect delinquent payments has a damaging effect on the town's public relations.

● Last year 12 summonses had to be issued causing him to spend seven and one-half days in court. The amount collected amounted to about one tenth of a mill.
