Oakville's 1958 Taxes Will Total \$1,065,000

Town manager Kenneth Needham, in announcing the 1958 budget, said the town's total assessment now stands at \$20,800,000, an increase of \$472,500 over last year. A total of \$1,065,000 will be raised by taxation. The industrial and commercial levy of the town was set at 5.27 mills, an increase of 28 mills over 1957.

45.4 Mill Trafalgar Rate Up 1.6 from Last Year

Trafalgar township council Monday night handed down a budget of \$2,104,535.45 and levied a residential tax rate of 45.4 mills, an increase of 1.65 mills over 1957. Basic mill rate in Trafalgar was levied at 20.4 mills. Added to this to make the general residential rate is a 1.1 mill garbage area levy, a 5 mill water area levy, and a 5.4 mill sewer area levy.

North Burlington Rate Set at 42.5 Mills for '58

A history-making residential mill rate, which shows increases up to 17 mills in some sections of the new town, was announced by Burlington council Monday night. People who live in the water and sewer areas below the Upper Middle Road will pay taxes based on 48.5 mills - regardless of what their rate was last year.
