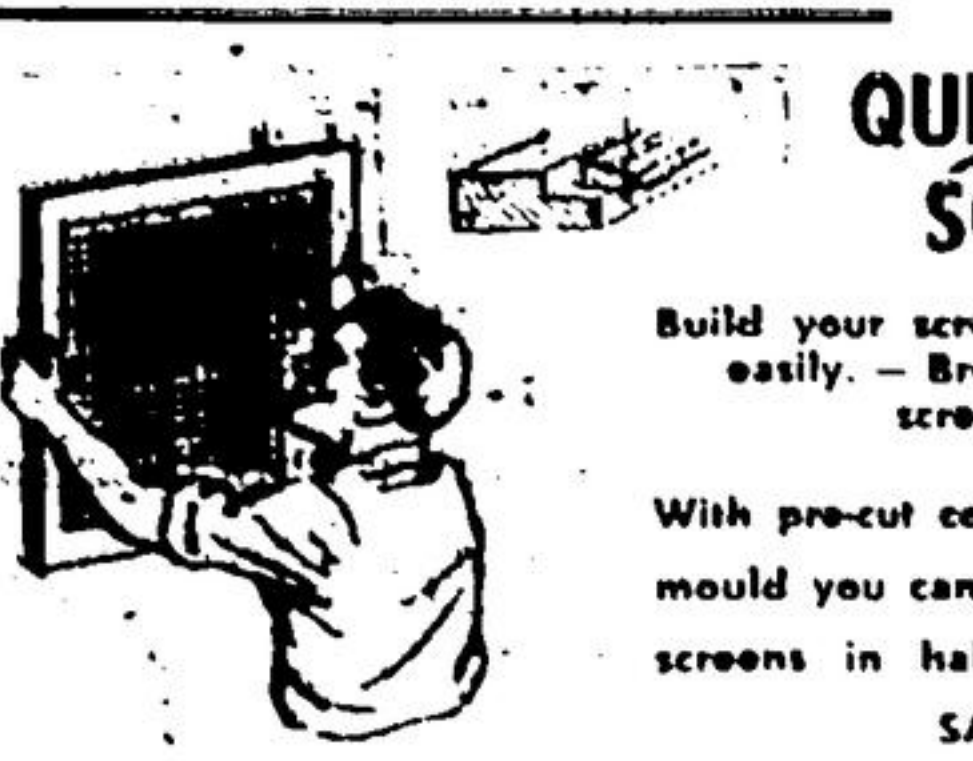
Following a buffet lunch, all enjoyed a sing-song.
