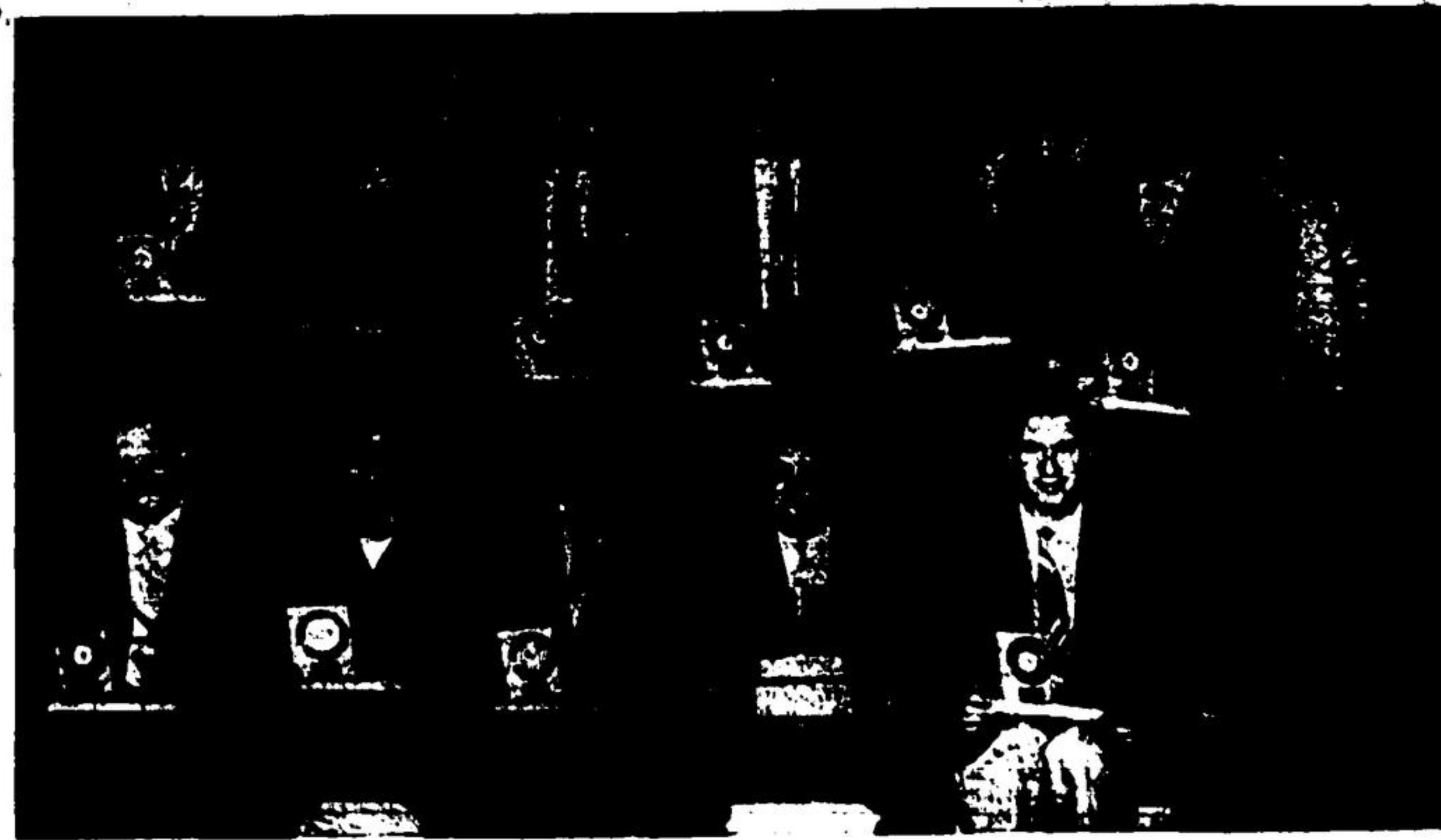
#### Acton Mixed
