## Discontinue \$20 Charge For Power Line to Spring

Discontinuation of a \$20.00 a month line charge to the waterworks department was authorized by the Acton Public Utilities Commission at their regular meeting on Thursday, May 15.

This action followed a review of the line charge when Secretary J. McGroarty pointed out the position had recommended the charge be discontinued.

The commission was informed the charge had been in effect since the line was first built to service the pumps at the spring water plant. Asked how long ago that was, Mr. McGroarty said he believed the charge had been in effect since 1920.

### Asks Clarification

A. Dubly, superintendent of the water department, reported previously by some of his employees over the wording of a recent motion regarding the wage scale for Acton utility employees.

The superintendent asked clarification of the term "casual" and "temporary" laborer.

Mayor W. H. Cook in giving his interpretation of the two terms

scheduled should be worked out between the two clubs.

The nod of approval was given by the Minor Sports Club to have the baseball diamond in the park graded and leveled at their own discretion.
