Executive Secretary To Visit Overseas

Mrs. Kenneth Knox, Lower Ave., executive secretary of the Canadian Save the Children Fund, left Canada on Tuesday, May 27 to visit the overseas teams working with children throughout Europe on behalf of the Fund.

While in Europe, Mrs. Knox will attend the International Union of Child Welfare in Geneva, Switzerland and the World Child Welfare Congress in Brussels, Belgium.

The primary object of her visit will be the opening of a Nursery Demonstration Centre built and equipped through the contributions of Canadians in Tricarico, Italy.

Mrs. Knox will also take the opportunity to see personally the Baby Home in Germany where for some years the children have been clothed by Canadian donations. She will also visit the Hospital for Crippled Children at Berlin, Austria, to

wards which the Canadian Fund contributed \$30,000.00 and in whose name four babies are dedicated.

She will witness at first hand the destitution and poverty with which the field-worker in Greece must constantly deal, in particular visiting the Save the Children Fund home established to train nurses in child care, and a leper colony whose blind child members are of particular concern to the Canadian Fund.


