Scale Models Help Chart Radio Waves Meeting Obstacles

MONTRÉAL (CP) An obstacle course for radio waves has been set up here by a group of scientists. Dr. H. E. J. Neubauer heads the team in the research laboratories of a large radio manufacturing company. They seek to reduce the cost of building communications networks across rugged terrain.

Dr. J. Remond Whitehead, re-
search director of the company (C.R.C.A. Victoria) said the team hopes to develop methods of placing transmitter tower sites quickly and cheaply from aerial surveys.

A scientific fact known as "ob-
stacle gain" is the basis for the re-
search team's work. Dr. Whitehead
explained that when radio waves
strike an object, they scatter. The
pattern can be calculated easily
with standard method when the
object is straight-edged. But some-
thing more is needed to find out
where the signal is strongest when
the waves hit irregularly shaped
mountains.

The team is conducting experiments, attempting to develop
mathematical equations for pre-
dicting the patterns and hence, the
best site for a transmission tower.
