**Start Repairs On Knox Ave.**

Repairs amounting to \$2,000 on Knox Avenue paving were started this week by the Credit Valley Paving Company. Paved two years ago at the time when other streets in Acton were completed, a 275 foot stretch failed to hold up due to water seepage and repair of this area was necessary. To make the current repairs, it was found necessary to install Hot-Car perforated pipe down each side of the road bed, varying from 30 inches to four feet running to the sanitary sewer catch basin. Covering the pipe will be 4 inch stone, covered with grade. A granulated material, topped with three inches of asphalt material. The road bed is being prepared around 18 inches deep and will be covered with 12 inches of gravel and three inches of asphalt. The asphalt paving will include top surface of base coat and new inch of top coat. Completion of the project is expected early next week, when the road will be opened once more to traffic.

**Return to P.S. Classrooms**

Close to 600 teachers will be on hand in Halton to greet some 16,500 public school students returning to classrooms in Halton next Tuesday. With the opening of schools this September, some changes have been made in the inspection of public schools in Halton County with the division of this County into two inspectors to be known as Halton No. 1 and Halton No. 2.

**Trafalgar Inspectorate**  
The new inspectorate, Halton No. 2 consists of the public schools in Trafalgar Township. L. L. Skuce, B.A., B.Ed., Public School Inspector in Halton County for the past 23 years, assumes the position of Superintendent of Public Schools in Trafalgar Township.

**Kenneth Armstrong, B.A., M.Ed.**, the former deputy principal of the Trafalgar schools, becomes Inspector of Public Schools for Halton No. 2. The township now includes about 3,500 public school children.

**Rest of County**  
The inspectorate of Halton No. 1 consists of the remainder of Halton County and comprises the Townships of Eramosa and Nassagaweya, the Village of Bronte, and the towns of Acton, Greater Burlington, Georgetown, Milton and Oakville.

**R. F. Barnhold, B.A., M.Ed.**, assistant to Mr. Skuce for the past six years, assumes the position of Inspector in charge of Halton No. 1. Assisted with him will be E. F. Jordan, B.A., M.Ed., inspector in this County for the past two years.

**W. L. McNeil, B.A., B.Ed.** is newly appointed to inspect duties in Halton.
