

## Steel Up, Blocks on Way For New Micro Building

Structural steel has been erected and cement block work is continuing on the new 40,000 square foot building being erected for the Micro Plastics Division of Frybrook Limited.

The new building is situated on the former Anthony Hufnagel property on Main Street, north.

Hahn and Paton are the general contractors erecting the 170 by 225 foot manufacturing plant plus an additional 46 x 30 foot office section.

Plumbing and heating contractors are this week installing sewer lateral, while steel erection workers are soldering the beam joints.

When completed the building will have a cement block wall and a 20 year bonded roof.

Occupancy of the plant is expected by the middle of November and this week an official from the general contractors reported, it would be completed on schedule.

When completed custom structures and sheetings will be manufactured in the new building.

A 1950 car driven by Oscar Broughton, R.R. 1, Acton, proceeding east on the highway, was in collision with a 1952 model car driven by Seigneur Rosset of Oakville.

Constable Ray Andress of the North Halton District O.P.P., investigated the accident and reported driving conditions were good, although darkness still prevailed.

It was reported the Broughton car had pulled out to pass another vehicle on the brow of a hill and met the oncoming vehicle.

The driver of the Oakville car reported he attempted to turn his vehicle into the ditch but was unable to avoid the collision.

Three passengers in the Rosset car escaped with a shaking up and minor cuts from flying glass and metal.
