## Farming Advances Main Change Joy Peal, Robert Smith Married Seen on Return Trip to China In Ceremony at St. Alban's

Recently returned from a four-week trip to China, E. H. Jolliffe, a well-known Toronto lawyer who makes his home in Rockwood, says it was curiously that brought about his desire to revisit China. He wanted to see the changes that have taken place in that country in the past 22 years.

Born in China, Mr. Jolliffe is the son of the Rev. and Mrs. Charles Jolliffe, Rockwood, who were missionaries in that country for many years. Mr. Jolliffe went to school as a boy in Chengtu, the largest centre of missionary work and 8,000 miles inland.

When he was 17, he travelled alone from China to Rockwood, attending Guelph Collegiate. Following high school, he graduated from the University of Toronto and was one of the two Rhodes scholars for 1930 in Ontario. He then studied law in Oxford and London, England.

### Notable Change

Most notable change in China is the improved farming methods. For the first time in its history, China has a wheat and rice surplus. The country is rapidly becoming industrialized, making every conceivable product with their own great natural resources. Products range from airplanes and high fidelity to drugs and locomotives, says Mr. Jolliffe.

Of great interest to scholars is the introduction this month in the

four primary grades of China's schools of a new written language, with Alton Anglican church Joy Donal in St. Albans Parish Hall. Mr. Peal became the bride of Robert Arthur Smith. Rev. Stuker officiated at the double ring ceremony on Friday, September 26.

Mr. Jolliffe travelled with four other Toronto lawyers to China as guests of the Chinese Law Association. During his time there, Mr. Jolliffe enjoyed a two-hour interview with Premier Chou En-lai.

Mr. Jolliffe, who is legal counsellor for many trade unions in Canada, has two sons, John, a student in Guelph Collegiate, and his father was before him and an architect, and Tommie, who attends Rockwood Public School. He also has two daughters, Naomi, who is in grade 11 in the Guelph Collegiate and Nancy in grade six, Rockwood school.

Mrs. Jolliffe is also a graduate of the University of Toronto. Both Mr. and Mrs. Jolliffe studied modern history.
