Acton High School football squad racked up an early win in the football season when they won their opener by defeating Georgetown 24-6 at the local school playing field on Thursday, October 2.

Slightly disorganized in the first quarter, Acton started their rally in the second as halfback Dale Woodburn found the loop holes in the Georgetown line and carried the ball with the assistance of Ross Shortell and Bob Kerr, up into the Raiders' end. Don Lindsay pulled a quarterback sneak and edged over the line for the first score.

With a six point lead, Acton bested a drive that paid off as a pass was intercepted by Dale Woodburn and carried over the line for six more points. The quarter ended with Acton leading 12-0.

Last Half

Encouraged by the Acton cheerleaders, the gridiron crew from the local school marched onto the field for the last half of the game determined to win their opener. They were stopped short when Hyde of Georgetown intercepted a long forward and trotted across the goal line for the Raiders' first tally.

Acton, pressing hard, drove the Georgetown lads back to their three yard line just as the gun went off to end the third quarter.

In the final quarter, with Acton resting on the opposition's three yard line, footnotes were prominent on both sides and finally Dale Woodburn took a lateral around the end and crossed the line for another six points.

A few minutes later Don Lindsay marched across the goal line after the locals had steadily driven the Georgetown crew back into their own end.

This ended the scoring with Acton coming out on top with a win amid cheers from their home supporters. The locals meet Milton tomorrow (Friday) in Milton.
