The new machine, equipped to tabulate hydro bills in two hours, will speed up office operations started town clerk J. McGeehan. Replacing an older machine which only covered 75% of the work mechanically, the new piece of equipment can be adapted to handle all billing and tabulating such as tax bills, payroll sheets and hydro bills reported the town clerk.

Ten dollars will pay for the medicine to treat 200 children for scabies, a tropical disease. And \$50 will treat 50 children or their parents for leprosy.

UNICEF funds also protect little ones against tuberculosis. Teachers in this town take care for their children's health by giving them vitamins, and training schools for child nurses. UNICEF will make good use of every penny.
